As you are hopefully aware, the State of Connecticut (State) intends to enter into an Agreement with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Under the Agreement, the NRC would relinquish to the State regulatory authority for certain licenses authorizing the use of byproduct, source, and special nuclear material. It is anticipated that the Agreement would become effective on or about September 30, 2025. You are receiving this email for awareness of the transition plan as an NRC materials licensee located in and/or authorized to use radioactive material in the State of Connecticut.

The NRC will suspend performance of work on incoming non-emergent licensing actions received after August 15, 2025. All new applications, amendment requests, and complex terminations received after that date will be forwarded to the State for completion. The NRC will continue to process requests that require immediate action through the anticipated effective date of the Agreement.

In addition, your NRC license authorizes you to conduct licensed activities at temporary jobsites anywhere the NRC maintains jurisdiction. We ask that you review your license and choose one of the following two options listed below.

Please reply to this email and place an X in the square indicating your selection of the options shown below. Your response to this matter is requested by no later than June 30, 2025.

☐ You have reviewed your current license and have determined that you need to maintain
both an NRC license and a State of Connecticut license. You therefore request that your
existing NRC license be amended to remove authorization for use of material in the State of
Connecticut and authorize work activities only in Non-Agreement States. In addition, you
request that the NRC issue a new license for work activities only in the State of
Connecticut. You understand that your new license will then be transferred to the State of
Connecticut in conjunction with the effective date of the Agreement between the NRC and
the State of Connecticut. You further understand that you will be assessed annual fees to
maintain both the NRC and the State of Connecticut licenses.

☐ You have reviewed your current license and no longer find it necessary for authorization
to conduct licensed activities in NRC-regulated states and therefore request that your
existing NRC license be amended to authorize the use of material only in the State of
Connecticut. You request that this be effective on the date the Agreement between the
NRC and the State of Connecticut is signed. You understand that upon the effective date of
the Agreement, you will be licensed by the State of Connecticut to conduct work only within
the State of Connecticut and as such must file an NRC form 241 (reciprocity) prior to
performing any work in States under the NRC's jurisdiction or in areas of Exclusive Federal
Jurisdiction. You further understand that upon the effective date of the Agreement you will
be assessed annual fees by the State of Connecticut.
