PART I.D -- COMMENTS

The FOIA Office received your FOIA request on August 7, 2024, and tasked the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board Panel (ASLBP), Region III (RIII), and the Office of Enforcement (OE) to locate the emails (dated 7/29/24, 7/30/24, and 8/3/24) responsive to your request.

ASLBP staff provided us records responsive to your request. These three emails were placed on the public Electronic Hearing Docket (EHD) for the Oconee license renewal proceeding, https://adams.nrc.gov/ehd/ in November 2024 under ML accession number ML24326A366; the emails are denominated as Attachments A-C in that pleading. Please note that the last attachment to the 7/29/24 email (Attachment A), identified as ML17352A430 in the email, was processed in response to a previous FOIA request, NRC-2018-000318. A redacted version of this Study may be found starting on page 4 of ML18179A032. We continue to assert FOIA exemption 5, as it incorporates the deliberative process privilege, and FOIA exemption 6, protecting the identity of the program participants, for the content redacted from the Study. As we explained in our response to that FOIA request, because the number of DPO and/or NPO submitters (whose identities may be publicly known as a result of the release of their DPO/NPO submissions) who were asked to participate in a confidential survey was small, the statistics pertaining to their response rates, and the nature of their responses, have been redacted in order to preserve the submitters' anonymity.

Prior to making Attachments A-C publicly available, NRC staff identified content that they identified as Critical Energy/ Electric Infrastructure Information (CEII), and consulted with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). FERC designated this redacted content as CEII. Once so designated, the NRC must withhold this content under FOIA exemption 3, in conjunction with 16 U.S.C. 824o-1(d).

Please refer to Part II for more information about the partial denial of information responsive to your request. This completes our processing of your request.
