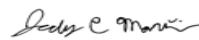

**Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation
Items of Interest**

Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation Staff Held a Public Workshop to Present Its Independent Technical Evaluations and Path Forward Regarding Two Key Topics Critical to the Near-Term Use of Higher Burnup and Increased Enrichment Fuel

On September 24, 2025, the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation staff held a public workshop to present its independent technical evaluations and path forward regarding two key topics critical to the near-term use of higher burnup and increased enrichment fuel: containment aerosol deposition and radiation equipment qualification issues related to radiological consequence analysis for operating reactors. The staff communicated its plans to issue a publicly available reference document before the end of the calendar year to support expected EPU-related licensing actions. Final guidance on these topics will be incorporated into Revision 2 of RG 1.183. The workshop was well-received, with stakeholders praising the staff's risk-informed approach in successfully addressing complex and challenging technical issues in a timely manner. The industry expressed support for the staff's path forward to resolve the two issues.

U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Staff Supported the NRC and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Quarterly Meeting

On September 25, 2025, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff supported the NRC and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) quarterly meeting, hosted at FERC Headquarters Office. The purpose of the meeting is for information exchange of technical presentations, discussions on the reliability of the Nation's electric power grid, as well as nuclear power plant safety and security. The NRC staff provided a presentation on the development of an NRC Regulatory Guide for the Offsite Power System. The Regulatory Guide will endorse the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Standard 765, "IEEE Standard for Preferred Power Supply for Nuclear Power Generating Stations," and IEEE Standard 1792 "IEEE Recommended Practice for Nuclear Power Generating Station Preferred Power Supply Reliability." The NRC staff also provided a presentation on the Nine Mile Point Unit 2 scram and FitzPatrick scram events on September 23, 2024. Finally, the NRC staff provided a presentation and discussed the status of the MOA/MOU between NRC and FERC.

Juniper Wi-Fi System Refresh

On September 23, 2025, contract number NNG15SD19B/31310025F0111 was awarded to Alvarez LLC in Leesburg, Virginia. The purpose of this contract is to obtain a Juniper Mist Wi-Fi system with a three-year maintenance package. The period of performance is from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, with one option period. The total potential value of the contract can be up to \$962,641.80.

Language Translation, Interpretation, and Multilingual Desktop Publishing Services

On September 24, 2025, contract number 31310025C0008 was awarded to Translation Excellence Inc. in Aurora, Colorado. The purpose of this contract is to obtain translation services in support of both the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) domestic mission to secure public health and safety; and its commitments to international cooperation, which includes contracts, arrangements, and letters of agreement with 33 foreign governments and international regulatory agencies. The period of performance is from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, with four option periods. The total potential value of the contract can be up to \$2,008,975.13.

Document Processing Center (DPC) Support Services

On September 19, 2025, contract number 31310025C0011 was awarded to Sault Tribe Government Solutions LLC in Sault Sainte Marie, Michigan. The purpose of this contract is to obtain document processing services, such as entering and filing documents electronically, performing database cleanup tasks, and converting old paper and microfiche-based documents into electronic format. The period of performance is from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, with four option periods. The total potential value of this contract can be up to \$9,830,196.31.

Purchase of Dell Laptops and Peripherals

On September 24, 2025, contract number 47QTCA19D00ML/31310025F0108 was awarded to MCP Computer Products, Inc. in San Marcos, California. The purpose of this contract is to purchase Dell laptops and accessories. The period of performance is from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, with no option periods. The total potential value of this contract can be up to \$2,162,815.93.

Health Physics Training

On September 22, 2025, contract number GS-00F-195CA/31310025F0092 was awarded to Oak Ridge Associated Universities Incorporated in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The purpose of this contract is to provide personnel with specific technical expertise and, as required, the necessary facilities and materials to conduct or assist in the delivery of various instructor-led training courses on various topics related to the field of Health Physics and associated NRC regulations as well as to develop E-Learning products in the subject areas discussed above and other nuclear topics. The period of performance is from December 1, 2025, through November 30, 2026, with four option periods. The total potential value of this contract can be up to \$8,162,621.37.
