Summary of Changes to One Procedure that Implements the Radiological Emergency Response Plan (RERP) for Wolf Creek Generating Station (WCGS)

1. Procedure AP 06-002, "Radiological Emergency Response Plan," Rev. 25

Procedure AP 06-002 has been revised with three overall changes.

The Joint Information Center (JIC) name was changed to Wolf Creek Information Center (WC-IC) which is part of the Wolf Creek Joint Media Center. The change is being made to provide clarification and avoid confusion with the Kansas Joint Information Center (JIC) co-located with the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). This change provides clarification for the information center staff who work jointly to prepare information for new conferences and dissemination to the media.

Editorial, minor wording, and grammar changes were made to incorporate comments received from the State of Kansas and Coffey County officials during the previous annual review and those identified during the revision process.

Reference to commitment RCMS 2005-118 was removed from the procedure. The text within the AP 06-002 sections that referenced the commitment were not otherwise changed. Updates to NRC guidance and regulation have made the commitment unnecessary.

The commitment was originally made in response to NRC Bulletin 2005-002, "Emergency Preparedness and Response Actions for Security-Based Events," dated July 18, 2005. The focus at that time was to improve licensees' ability to implement protective measures during radiological emergencies and address vulnerabilities identified after the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. The commitment had the RERP for WCGS revised to include provisions for drills and exercises using terrorist-based-events. Further guidance concerning this topic was later released in NRC Interim Staff Guidance NSIR/DPR-ISG-01, "Emergency Planning for Nuclear Power Plants," released in November 2011 and the amended sections IV.F.2.i and IV.F.2.j of 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix E.

AP 06-002 complies with the NRC Interim Staff Guidance and the amended regulation. This makes Commitment RCMS 2005-118 no longer necessary. The commitment change process detailed in WCGS Procedure, AI 26D-001, "Commitment Management System," was utilized to change the commitment's status from one-time to archived and remove references to the commitment from AP 06-002. Information regarding this commitment change will be discussed in the yearly WCGS Updated Safety Analysis Report submittal letter to the NRC in accordance with the guidance of Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) 99-04, "Guidelines for Managing NRC Commitment Changes," Revision 0, July 1999.

These changes do not reduce the effectiveness of the Wolf Creek Radiological Emergency Response Plan.
