U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Staff Accepted Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC's Application for an Early Site Permit (ESP) at Belews Creek

On February 8, 2026, the staff accepted Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC's application for an early site permit (ESP) at the Belews Creek, North Carolina site (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. [ML26016A623](#)). The letter includes milestones to issue the final safety evaluation and final environmental impact statement by May 2027 (15 months from acceptance). A Notice announcing the acceptance and offering an opportunity to request a hearing and petition for leave to intervene was published in the *Federal Register* on February 9 ([91 FR 5787](#)).

NRC Granted an Exemption from Specific Requirements of 10 CFR 50.69 for Vogtle, Units 3 and 4

On February 10, 2026 (ML25262A038), U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) granted an exemption from specific requirements of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 50, Section 50.69, "Risk-informed categorization and treatment of structures, systems and components for nuclear power reactors," for the Vogtle, Units 3 and 4. This was an NRC-initiated exemption to allow Southern Nuclear Operating Company (SNC), as "holder" of a Combined License, to voluntarily adopt 10 CFR 50.69. SNC plans to submit a 50.69 license amendment soon.

NRC Issued Information Notice 2026-02, Using Generic Process Checklists in Medical Care to Prevent Human Error

On February 6, 2026, the NRC issued Information Notice 2026-02, *Using Generic Process Checklists in Medical Care to Prevent Human Error* ([ML25253A455](#)). The purpose is to inform licensees of a recommendation to use generic process checklists prior to and during the medical use of byproduct material as a result of an assessment of medical events and their causes.

U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Launches Webpage to Improve Licensing Efficiency for Brownfield Sites

On February 11, 2026, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) launched a webpage ([link](#)) outlining potential licensing efficiencies for brownfield and/or retired fossil fuel sites. The webpage includes background information and a checklist of efficiency tools for applicants and NRC staff to consider. This initiative fulfills the NRC's commitment in its September 2025 report to Congress, "*Regulatory Issues for Nuclear Facilities at Brownfield and/or Retired Fossil Fuel Sites*," to create a resource that helps applicants and staff leverage existing site characterization data, studies, and permits in the NRC licensing process. The webpage is a part of the broader streamlining efficiencies associated with Section 206 of the ADVANCE Act.
