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NRC to Hold a Public Meeting on Proposed Rule and Related ASME Codes

ROCKVILLE, Md.—The Nuclear Regulatory Commission will hold a public meeting to discuss a [proposed rule](#) published Feb. 27, 2026, that would update 10 CFR 50.55a to incorporate by reference the 2023 Edition of the ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code, proposed revisions to three regulatory guides, and related ASME code cases.

When: April 6, 2026, 1-4 p.m. Eastern time

How: This is an [informational public meeting](#) with a question-and-answer session. NRC staff will discuss regulatory and technical issues related to the topic and answer questions from participants.

Note: NRC will not be accepting comments during the meeting.

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission was created as an expert, technical agency to protect public health, safety, and security, and regulate the civilian use of nuclear materials, including enabling the deployment of nuclear power for the benefit of society. Among other responsibilities, the agency issues licenses, conducts inspections, initiates and enforces regulations, and plans for incident response. The NRC is collaborating with interagency partners to implement reforms outlined in new Executive Orders and the ADVANCE Act to streamline agency activities and enhance efficiency.
