Dear Ms. Greenwald:

Thank you for your June 16, 2026, letter requesting that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) schedule a public Commission meeting regarding the agency's rulemaking activities associated with Executive Order (EO) 14300, Ordering the Reform of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. I appreciate the Nuclear Innovation Alliance's (NIA's) continued engagement, its support for the Commission's reform efforts, and the constructive input your organization has provided throughout these rulemakings.

The agency has been publishing the proposed rules for public comment, holding public meetings for staff to answer stakeholder questions about the proposed rules, making supporting documents publicly available in the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), and maintaining a dedicated public webpage that tracks the status of the EO 14300 rulemaking activities. The Commission has also addressed some EO 14300 proposed rules during relevant business line briefings.

Although the Commission also originally planned to hold a Commission meeting to discuss the EO 14300 rulemakings as a whole, we instead chose to focus on the staff-led public meetings for each individual rulemaking at this time. These targeted meetings will encourage thorough public discussions about each rulemaking and will better align the rules' publication and comment periods with their corresponding public meetings. If a Commission meeting focused on EO 14300 is scheduled in the future, notice will be provided through the NRC's normal public meeting notification process.

The Commission understands the interest expressed by NIA and other stakeholders in receiving information regarding these rulemakings, and we acknowledge our shared interest in executing the most comprehensive regulatory redesign in 50 years to accelerate the safe, efficient deployment and expansion of nuclear technologies. We encourage NIA to continue submitting comments on proposed rules as they become available. Thank you again for your engagement and your organization's consistent commitment to supporting a strong, credible, and effective regulatory framework for nuclear innovation.
