The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff is conducting a review of the environmental effects of the proposed renewal of the operating license for the Cooper Nuclear Station (Cooper) for an additional 20 years. Cooper is operated by Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD), and is located in Nemaha County, Nebraska and Atchison County, Missouri (see enclosed maps). NPPD submitted an application for subsequent license renewal (SLR) in a letter dated May 7, 2026, pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 54.

As part of the NRC's licensing review, the NRC staff is initiating Section 106 consultation under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (NHPA). See attached correspondence.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 800, the NRC invites you to submit any comments or concerns that you may have regarding NHPA Section 106 consultation for the Cooper SLR application within 30 days. When available, information and analyses concerning historic and cultural resources will be shared in subsequent consultation.
