Dear Troy Gallaher:

This refers to your license amendment request dated May 11, 2026. Enclosed is Amendment No. 18, which authorizes updates to the management contact and mailing address. Please note that although the revised address pertains to the storage location, the NRC cannot approve storage of licensed material at the proposed site; such approval must be obtained from the regulatory authority with jurisdiction over that location. During the review of your amendment request, a previous specific condition regarding transportation of licensed material under 10 CFR Part 71 was removed because it is already covered by the general statement at the top of your license. Additionally, the authorized material limits have been updated to remove the CPN PORTAPROBE Series devices and to reduce the total activity authorized for the Troxler 3400 Series gauges.

An environmental assessment for this action was not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(a)(10).

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. You will be periodically inspected by the NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with the NRC will result in enforcement action(s) against you. This could include issuance of a Notice of Violation, or Imposition of a Civil Penalty, or an Order Suspending, Modifying or Revoking Your License as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
