On August 20, 2026, the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulations, Office of the Chief Nuclear Reactor Inspector, and Office of Nuclear Regulatory Research staff participated in the Pressurized Water Reactor Owners Group Risk Management Committee meeting. The staff delivered presentations to provide updates on the following topics: maintenance risk assessment & emergent work control, NRC organizational changes, rulemaking and the NRC philosophy on risk-informed changes, and operating experience for digital instrumentation and control system reliability and risk assessment. These meetings continue to provide positive exchange opportunities between the NRC and industry on topics of mutual interest associated with risk-informed decisionmaking.

NRC Issues Trial Regulatory Guide on Probabilistic Risk Assessment for Public Comment

On August 14, 2026, the staff re-issued Trial Regulatory Guide (RG) 1.247 Revision 1, "Acceptability of Probabilistic Risk Assessment Results for Non-Light Water Reactor Risk-Informed Activities." Revision 1 to Trial RG 1.247 is being re-issued (with minimal changes to reflect the issuance of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 53) for an additional three-year trial period. This trial guide describes an acceptable approach for determining whether the acceptability of the probabilistic risk assessment (PRA) used to support a PRA application is sufficient to provide confidence in the results for non-light water reactors (NLWRs) and risk-informed activities. Trial RG 1.247 was initially issued in March 2022 with a 2-year trial period that ended in May 2024. Revision 1 to RG 1.247 is being reissued as a trial guide so that it can still be used by potential applicants while the staff addresses the remaining technical issues, which are best resolved by continuing to test the guide against actual applications. A *Federal Register* notice ([91 FR 53903](#)) announcing its availability was published on August 20, 2026.

NRC Issues Draft Regulatory Guide on Risk Metrics and Performance Objectives for Public Comment

On August 14, 2026, the staff issued Draft Regulatory Guide (DG) 1443 for RG 1.263 Revision 0, "Comprehensive Risk Metrics and Associated Risk Performance Objectives for Commercial Nuclear Plants," (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. [ML26100A075](#)). DG-1443 is being issued for a 30-day public comment period. This revision provides the NRC staff guidance on developing comprehensive risk metrics and associated risk performance objectives to support a technology-inclusive, risk-informed, and performance-based approach to the design and operation of commercial nuclear plants under 10 CFR Part 53. A *Federal Register* notice ([91 FR 53901](#)) announcing its availability was published on August 20, 2026.

NRC Issues Draft Regulatory Guide on Assessing Public Health Risk for Public Comment

On August 14, 2026, the staff issued DG 1444 for RG 1.264 Revision 0, "Assessing Public Health Risk Associated with Chemical Hazards of Licensed Material Under 10 CFR Part 53," ([ML25043A094](#)). DG-1444 is being issued for a 30-day public commenting period. This RG is being issued to provide guidance on an acceptable approach for meeting the regulation under 10 CFR 53.440(k), which requires defining design features and related functional design criteria such that analyses demonstrate a low risk of permanent injury to public health due to the health effects of chemical hazards of licensed material. A *Federal Register* Notice ([91 FR 54406](#)) announcing its availability was published on August 21, 2026.
