



SUBJECT: FINAL RULE, EXPAND APPLICABILITY OF PART 72 TO HOLDERS OF,
AND APPLICANTS FOR, CERTIFICATES OF COMPLIANCE AND
THEIR CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS

The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) has reviewed the subject final rule and concurs in it with the following modifications. Replace the "Paperwork Reduction Act Statement" and the "Public Notification Statement" on pages 23 and 24 of the rule with Attachment 1. Modify "Comment 11, Response" on page 19 to reflect that the reporting requirement has been eliminated from 72.242. In response to comment 9 on page 16, add the following to "Recommendation (e)," page 5 of the Commission Paper: The increase in burden for information collections has been determined insignificant by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and does not require further OMB review. Paperwork Reduction Act Statement

This final rule increases the burden on licensees by expanding the applicability of Part 72 to holders of, and applicants for, Certificates of Compliance. The public burden for this information collection is estimated to average 5 hours per request. Because the burden for this information collection is insignificant, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) clearance is not required. Existing requirements were approved by the Office of Management and Budget, approval number 3150-0132.

Public Protection Notification

If a means used to impose an information collection does not display a currently valid OMB control number, the NRC may not conduct or sponsor, and a person is not required to respond to, the information collection.
