
Dear Sir:

The Southern Nuclear Operating Company (SNC) recently filed an application with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission requesting that Plant Hatch be allowed to extend its operation for an additional twenty years. Having had the opportunity to visit Plant Hatch through many school field trips and having had the opportunity to listen to Plant Hatch/Georgia Power employees make presentations to many community groups such as Lions Club and Kawanis Club, I personally am convinced that the "Plant" is operated by individuals who are conscientious about their job duties and responsibilities regarding the public that they serve. Obviously, this letter is written in support of the SNC's request to ask for the twenty year extension.
