NOVEMBER 27, 1992

Started the Exploratory Studies Facility (ESF) site preparation construction activities on November 25, 1992, immediately after receiving the Energy Systems Acquisition Advisory Board's (ESAAB) approval. Initial construction activities involved the removal of topsoil from the rock storage area. Construction of the access road from H Road to the North Portal Pad will begin on November 30, 1992.

I. CRITICAL ITEM STATUS - YUCCA MOUNTAIN SITE CHARACTERIZATION PROJECT (YMP)

A. Site Characterization Planning

Field Operations

Three drill rigs were operating this week: the LM-300 drill rig at Borehole UZ-16, the CME-850 drill rig at Neutron Access Borehole USW UZN-58, and the Joy 1 drill rig at Borehole NRG-6.

Crews are mobilizing to start ESF construction this week.

On Job Package 92-3, drilling activities continue with the LM-300 drill rig on Borehole UZ-16. As of November 23, 1992, Reynolds Electrical & Engineering Co., Inc. (REECo), had cored to a depth of 1083.27 feet and reamed to 1069.02 feet.

Sample Management Facility

Processing of core and recovery of core and cuttings from UE25 UZ-16 continued. Also, processing of core from USW UZN-58 continued. Testing of the dust collection system for dry-cut saws was successfully completed.

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Site Investigations

After completion of mapping and descriptions, Trenches MWV-T5 and MWV-T7 in the ESF North Access site area were backfilled.

Geophysical and camera logging were completed at Borehole NRG-1; the borehole was prepared for plugging and abandonment.

Backfilling of test pits and trenches in the footprint of the ESF North Portal pad is underway. All pit and trench logging and sampling is complete.

Drilling on Borehole NRG-6 commenced this week with an initial 6 feet of hole penetration on November 23, 1992.

Fracture pavement mapping at the NRG-1 pavement and mapping of the Fran Ridge test pit is complete.

The CME-850 drill rig was mobilized at the USW UZN-59 site; drilling will commence following the plugging and abandonment of NRG-1.

Regulatory InteractionsSite Characterization Progress Report (PR)

PR 6 was approved by the Secretary of Energy on November 19, 1992. The Civilian Radioactive Waste Management System Management and Operating Contractor (CRWMS M&O) prepared the camera-ready copy; it was sent from the Yucca Mountain Site Characterization Project Office (YMPO) to RW-2 by overnight mail the same day. Distribution of PR 6 is expected in early December 1992. YMPO has received some comments on the review draft of PR 7.

Critical ESF SP Status:

SP 8.3.1.2.2.4, "Characterization of the Yucca Mountain Unsaturated Zone Percolation ESF Study," will be submitted to YMPO by December 1, 1992.

The YMPO completed screening review of SP 8.3.1.4.2.2, Revision 2, "Characterization of Structural Features Within the Site Area." The SP is currently undergoing YMPO technical review.

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B. Project Planning and Control

Revised fiscal year (FY) 1993 cost/schedule planning data were received from all participants and are being processed. The costs and schedules are based on FY 1993 funding and assumptions/priorities. The Planning and Control System Project Control group is analyzing the data to see if it is acceptable for baselining.

Technical direction letters regarding participant planning data for review and work authorization signature were distributed for the Division Directors.

The staff attended last week's ESAAB meeting in Washington, D.C. The Board provided verbal approval for Key Decision 3A: Start ESF Site Preparation/Construction. Formal written approval was received November 25, 1992.

C. Quality Assurance Implementation

Implementation

The Assessment Team (AT) recommended acceptance of the Raytheon Services Nevada (RSN) classification on access roads and topsoil storage area thereby allowing field work to begin on November 24, 1992. Review of the classification report on the TBM continues.

The AT is now focusing its resources on classification and development of the Q and MC Lists.

D. Public Outreach and Institutional Activities

A tour to Yucca Mountain, Nevada, was conducted on November 23, 1992, for ten guests of the Palo Verde Nuclear Power Station. Michael Voegele, Technical and Management Support Services (T&MSS), gave a pretour briefing to the group. A tour was also conducted on November 24, 1992, for three guests from Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL).

Michael Voegele provided a general overview presentation to the West Las Vegas Community Leaders on November 23, 1992, in Las Vegas, Nevada. Approximately 20 people attended the presentation.

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Richard Arnold, a consultant, gave an educational presentation to approximately 300 students in kindergarten through third grades at the Martin Luther King Elementary School on November 24, 1992, in Las Vegas.

Mindy Wadkins and Melinda d'Ouille, both from T&MSS, gave a presentation on public acceptance and the YMP Outreach programs to the Japan Atomic Industrial Forum on November 25, 1992. The presentation was provided to approximately 10 people at the Las Vegas Yucca Mountain Information Office.

A. C. Robison, YMPO, and Beatrice Reilly and Paul Seidler, both from Science Applications International Corporation, attended two meetings in Washington, D.C., on November 24, 1992. The first meeting, the Public Involvement Model Review Meeting, involved reviewing the model as a decision-aiding tool in determining when an Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management (OCRWM) activity should be subject to public review and comment. The second meeting, the OCRWM Communications Handbook Meeting, involved a review of the preliminary draft of the handbook. The handbook is designed to strengthen the program's communications efforts, clarify DOE policies and procedures with regard to communications and offer information on available resources to assist staff with their communications needs.

II. ANALYSIS & VERIFICATION DIVISION

The staff presented a briefing on the Occurrence Reporting and Processing System to YMP personnel on November 23, 1992, in Las Vegas.

Conference papers were reviewed for the upcoming 1992 Materials Research Society Meeting on the Scientific Basis for Waste Management session on Performance Assessment relating to Engineered Barrier Systems.

The staff began preparing papers on the Waste Acceptance Process for High-Level Vitrified Waste for the 1993 International High-Level Radioactive Waste Management Conference in Las Vegas and the Waste Management 1993 Symposium in Tucson, Arizona.

Alan Berusch was appointed to chair the Nuclear Waste Engineering Materials Development Subcommittee of the DOE Energy Materials and Coordinating Committee.

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III. GENERAL INFORMATION ITEMSLLNL

Hydrothermal calculations of the heat and fluid flow in the saturated zone (SZ) due to the radioactive waste heat have geochemical consequences in the SZ due to increased temperatures and flow rates. Scoping calculations of these impacts are underway, including the possibility of simulating them in LLNL's Large Block Tests.

LLNL testing is being modified in response to the proposed accelerated ESF schedule. Two tests may be required in the north ramp, and two additional tests may be required on the Main Test Level to provide the data needed for the site suitability determination and the license application.

Los Alamos National Laboratory (Los Alamos)

A Los Alamos milestone report, "Geological Evaluation of Six Nonwelded Tuff Sites in the Vicinity of Yucca Mountain, Nevada, for a Surface-Based Test Facility for the YMP," was completed and will be submitted to YMPO for review and approval.

Approval was received from YMPO on a conference abstract, "Distribution of Fracture-Lining Zeolites at Yucca Mountain, Nevada," and a conference paper, "Surface-Discharging of Hydrothermal Systems at Yucca Mountain--Examining the Evidence."

A field trip was held to observe the geochronology of Cind-R-Lite volcanic center and to coordinate the volcanism studies with the tectonic studies of the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS).

RSN

The TBM specification was completed and approved by YMPO.

REECO

Representatives from the Information Management Department attended a teleconference of the DOE Special Interest Group (SIG) Committee on DOE/NQA-1 and the National Archive and Records Association Committee on Records Terminology. The initial task is to establish a list of documents that contain terminology applicable to the OCRWM records management program. The committee will review these documents for use and comparison of definition of terms. This will provide a basis to evaluate the terms and definitions, and make recommendations to the Nuclear Information Records Management Association DOE SIG.

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T&MSS

The Institutional and External Affairs staff have distributed over 7,000 new folders and fact sheets. This included the "Why are Scientists Studying Yucca Mountain?" folder and the following fact sheets:

Critical ESF SP Status:

The comment resolution meeting on SP 8.3.1.2.2.4, "Characterization of the Yucca Mountain Unsaturated Zone Percolation ESF Study," was held on December 18, 1992. The comment verification draft was promised by December 28, 1992.

As indicated above, SP 8.3.1.4.2.2, Revision 2, "Characterization of Structural Features Within the Site Area," was approved by YMPO; it is scheduled for submittal to NRC by January 7, 1993.

B. Project Planning and Control

The November 1992 cost and schedule performance report booklets were compiled and distributed for Project Manager Carl Gertz, the Division Directors, and project work breakdown structure element managers. The performance report booklets were also provided to several Civilian Radioactive Waste Management System Management and Operating Contractor (CRWMS M&O) functional managers.

A cost/schedule change request, which adds fiscal year (FY) 1992 carryover funding to the FY 1993 cost baseline, was prepared.

C. Quality Assurance (QA) ImplementationDetermination of Importance and Grading EnhancementImplementation

The Assessment Team (AT) provided an acceptance recommendation to YMPO for the CRWMS M&O's classification plan.

The AT is initiating efforts to determine the classification of the natural barriers Important to Waste Isolation as a step in developing the Quality (Q)-List. The effort will consist of an initial (short-term) classification based on existing basis information and expert judgment, followed by a comprehensive (long-term) performance assessment effort to confirm and refine the Q-List.

Scoping continues on the phase-out plan for Administrative Procedure 6.17Q, Classification of Items.

D. Public Outreach and Institutional Activities

The Institutional and External Affairs staff produced the video, "The Yucca Mountain Studies--ESF." The twenty-minute video, which is intended for a technical audience, depicts surface and laboratory site characterization activities. The video also uses computer animation to explain the underground design and tests planned for the ESF.

Carl Gertz and A. C. Robison, YMPO, conducted briefings with Nevada legislators December 22-23, 1992, at the Las Vegas Yucca Mountain Information Office.

Two transition briefing paper responses were revised on site characterization and Nuclear Waste Technical Review Board (NWTB).

Review of the Defense Waste Processing Facility Waste Qualification Report (WQR), Volume 1, and West Valley WQR, Package 1, was initiated in preparation for the January 1993 Technical Review Group comment consensus meeting in Augusta, Georgia.

III. GENERAL INFORMATION ITEMS

Los Alamos National Laboratory

Porous cups for the lower-boundary device for the caisson experiment have been tested in the laboratory. The lower-boundary device will be installed as soon as the necessary health and safety issues for caisson access have been satisfied.

Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory

At the request of CRWMS M&O, repository scale (including the saturated zone) hydrothermal calculations were conducted at Areal Power Densities of 20 and 114 kW/acre and for burnups of 21, 26, and 30 years (corresponding to Youngest Fuel First-YFF, Oldest Fuel First-OFF, and reference cases). For the 20 kW/acre cases, peak temperatures are similar (55 to 60 degrees Celsius [C]), but the time of peak temperature varies from 150 to 729 years. Most of the temperature buildup occurs during the first 100 years in each case; this time is too short to smooth package-to-package and drift-to-drift temperature profiles and, hence, the actual peak temperatures would be higher. For the 114 kW/acre cases, the peak temperature ranges from 178 to 203 degrees C at times between 122 and 602 years; again, most of the temperature buildup occurs in the first 100 years. For these 114 kW/acre cases, the duration of boiling ranges from 7331 to 11,450 years; these times are long enough to smooth local temperature variations.

CRWMS M&O

The first four classification analyses for the ESF surface design were completed. This is a prerequisite to the release of the engineering drawings for construction.

U.S. Geological Survey (USGS)

The staff addressed open items of the NRC's Site Characterization Analysis relating to SP 8.3.1.4.2.2, "Characterization of Structural Features Within the Site Area." At the urgent request of DOE/CRWMS M&O, responses were provided for Comment 36 and Question 5. Detailed mapping of the ESF excavations will provide information to characterize the imbricate fault zone (Comment 36), now that the ESF no longer includes a perimeter drift. Low-angle, large-bore ESF ramps and drifts will provide information on vertical and near-vertical structures (Question 5).

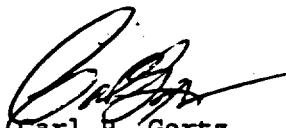

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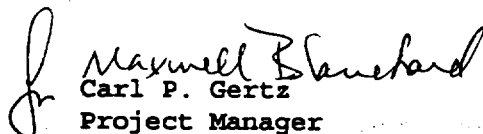
