Dear Mr. Downs:

The purpose of this letter is to advise the Utah Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste ("Utah DSHW") that International Uranium (USA) Corporation ("IUSA") has completed its response to the subject Order for Compliance ("Order"). The Order required, by May 31, 2000, the complete removal and off-site disposal of approximately 21 tons of material characterized as hazardous waste (based upon lead content) which had been improperly shipped from the Boston Artery Tunnel Project ("Boston Material") to the White Mesa Uranium Mill (the "Mill"). In response to IUSA's several requests for extensions, Utah DSHW extended the removal date to October 2, 2000. The Order further required, among other things, that following such removal notice be sent to the Executive Secretary as to (1) the name of the facility where the material was sent and (2) the total amount shipped; together with a copy of the manifest.

As you know, the Boston Material was inadvertently delivered to the Mill and placed onto an ore pile at the Mill that contained 480 cubic yards of material from the Ashland 1 FUSRAP Site, and which had been shipped to the Mill as uranium-bearing alternate feed material to be processed for uranium under the terms of the Mill's NRC License. In response to the Order, and as described in the report entitled "Completion of Ore Lot #78 Material Segregation at the White Mesa Mill" (IUSA, August 7, 2000), a copy of which has been provided to you, the Boston Material was successfully segregated from the Ashland material in accordance with the Segregation Plan submitted to the Utah DSHW and the NRC on May 22, 2000. The segregation resulted in the Boston Material being placed in a container for shipment off-site.

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In accordance with the Order, IUSA hereby advises the Utah DSHW of the following:

- 1. On October 2, 2000, the package containing the Boston Material was removed from the Mill site by Diamond S Trucking, Inc., under contract to MHF-Logistical Solutions, for delivery to the disposal facility, Waste Control Specialists ("WCS"). The WCS facility is located in Andrews, Texas.
- 2. The total weight of the Boston Material shipped to WCS was approximately 21.6 tons.
- 3. The package containing the Boston Material was acknowledged received by WCS on October 9, 2000. IUSA was advised by WCS that it normally takes thirty days to transmit the signed manifest acknowledging receipt to the generator; however, in response to our request that WCS expedite transmittal of the signed manifest so that the manifest could be transmitted to the Utah DSHW, IUSA received the attached copy of the fully executed manifest on October 23, 2000.

This transmittal is meant to complete compliance with all items in Order for Compliance No. 0002007. In accordance with letters dated June 2, 2000 and July 7, 2000 from yourself, on behalf of the Utah DSHW, and Philip Ting of the NRC, respectively, the remainder of Ore Lot #78 is now regulated by the U.S. NRC and may be processed at the Mill by IUSA.

IUSA appreciates Utah DSHW's input and comment during development of the approach to segregating and removing the Boston Material to an approved disposal facility. Should you require any further information, please contact me at 303.389.4130.
