**APPLICANT'S UNOPPOSED REQUEST TO INCREASE MAXIMUM PAGES
FOR UTAH K AND UTAH L MOTIONS FOR SUMMARY DISPOSITION**

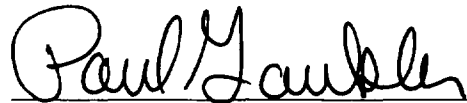
Applicant Private Fuel Storage L.L.C. ("Applicant" or "PFS") will be filing motions for summary disposition with respect to Contentions Utah K and Utah L by the December 29, 2000, deadline for filing such motions. The maximum length for summary disposition motions filed by the deadline is twenty pages for each contention.¹ In accordance with the Licensing Board's Memorandum and Order of February 2, 1998 (Memorializing Initial Prehearing Conference Directives), the Applicant requests the Board to increase the maximum length of summary disposition motions for Contentions Utah K and Utah L from twenty to thirty pages for each contention. There are numerous issues with respect to each contention that will require more than twenty pages to adequately present the issues to the Board for decision. Applicant believes that thirty

pages will be sufficient and therefore is requesting the Board to increase the maximum length of summary disposition motions for each contention to thirty pages.

Counsel for Applicant has conferred with counsel for the State and the NRC Staff. Neither opposes this request as long as the maximum length for party responses is also increased to thirty pages. WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that the maximum length of summary disposition motions, and party responses thereto, filed with respect to Contentions Utah K and Utah L be increased to thirty pages for each contention.

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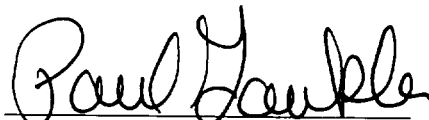
