SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF CATEGORY 2 PUBLIC MEETING BETWEEN
THE NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION STAFF AND
STAKEHOLDERS CONCERNING DRAFT NUREG-1022,
REVISION 3

On February 2, 2012, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff met with members of the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), as well as with other members of industry, to discuss Draft NUREG-1022, Revision 3. NUREG-1022 is titled "Event Reporting Guidelines 10 CFR 50.72 and 50.73." The NRC has received comments on the draft NUREG and the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the comments so that the NRC fully understands them prior to disposition.

A public meeting notice was issued on January 5, 2012, and was posted on the NRC's external (public) web page (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML12010A174).

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MEETING SUMMARY

- The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) presented a summary of each of the comments received.
- Specific discussions were held on several of the received comments in order to ensure that the comments were understood. The NRC indicated that any additional supporting information received within the next week could be considered.
- The NRC also discussed several internal stakeholder issues that were raised. The issues include:
 - Section 3.2.2, "Operation or Condition Prohibited by Technical Specifications": Including an example addressing situations in which TS allow 30 days for a licensee to receive results of a charcoal sample.
 - Section 3.2.2, "Operation or Condition Prohibited by Technical Specifications": Entry into LCO 3.0.3 for more than 1 hour should continue to constitute a condition prohibited by Technical Specifications.
 - Section 3.2.4, "Degraded or Unanalyzed Conditions": Considerations for compensatory measures, if any.
 - Scope of systems for Section 3.2.7, "Event or Condition that Could Have Prevented Fulfillment of a Safety Function," and 3.2.8, "Common Cause Inoperability of Independent Trains or Channels" should include any FSAR systems.
 - Scope of systems for Section 3.2.7, "Event or Condition that Could Have Prevented Fulfillment of a Safety Function," should include safe shutdown systems.
 - Functions discussed in the FSAR that may not necessarily be tied to the accident analysis should be considered in determining if losses have occurred.
 - Fire protection aspects should be included in Section 3.2.7, "Event or Condition that Could Have Prevented Fulfillment of a Safety Function," and 3.2.8, "Common Cause Inoperability of Independent Trains or Channels."
 - NSIR comment regarding routine notifications to other agencies.
- The NRC indicated it would consider an implementation period after finalization of NUREG-1022, Revision 3. Ninety days was requested by industry representatives.
- The NRC indicated that the next public meeting would be after comments were dispositioned and prior to finalization of NUREG-1022, Revision 3.
