Dear Mr. Kitchen:

Our office received and reviewed the above referenced survey report in accordance with Section 106 of the *National Historic Preservation Act of 1966* (Public Law 89-665), as amended in 1992, and 36 C.F.R., *Part 800: Protection of Historic Properties*, and Chapter 267, *Florida Statutes*, for assessment of possible adverse impact to cultural resources (any prehistoric or historic district, site, building, structure, or object) listed, or eligible for listing, in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

In May 2011, Southeastern Archaeological Research, Inc. (SEARCH) conducted an archaeological and historical Phase I survey of three proposed accessory parcels on behalf of Progress Energy Florida, Inc. SEARCH identified four previously unrecorded archaeological sites and one archaeological occurrence within the project area during the investigation. SEARCH determined that the lithic scatter sites (8LV813 – 8LV816) do not appear to have sufficient research potential for listing in the NRHP based on their low density and lack of diagnostic artifacts.


SEARCH determined that the proposed development will have no effect on cultural resources listed, or eligible for listing, on the NRHP. SEARCH recommends no further investigation of the parcels.

Based on the information provided, our office concurs with these determinations and finds the submitted report complete and sufficient in accordance with Chapter 1A-46, *Florida Administrative Code*.
