

Hitting the Ceiling

By Kellie Lunney

The ongoing threat of government shutdown this year has sparked talk of furloughs and concern over federal pay. But there's another crisis looming that temporarily could affect employees' benefits -- the creep toward the debt ceiling.

When the federal government's spending outstrips its revenue, the Treasury can borrow money by selling bonds to the public; these bonds comprise the public debt of the United States. But when that debt increases toward the maximum allowed by current law, Congress either must reduce the debt or raise its ceiling. To avoid exceeding the ceiling, the Treasury secretary is authorized to temporarily suspend investment of amounts in the Civil Service Retirement and Disability Fund, and in the Thrift Savings Plan's government securities (G) fund, the most stable offering in TSP's portfolio of retirement investments. The G Fund is invested in interest-bearing Treasury securities -- bonds -- that comprise the public debt. The Civil Service Retirement Fund finances benefit payments

under the Civil Service Retirement System and the basic retirement annuity of the Federal Employees' Retirement System, and those investments are made up of securities also considered part of the public debt.

The government will hit the congressionally mandated debt limit of \$14.3 trillion sometime between April 15 and May 31, and so far Congress has not made much headway staving off that potential mess. House Speaker John Boehner, R-Ohio, has expressed resistance to raising the debt ceiling if more spending cuts don't materialize in the next iteration of the continuing resolution.

So what does this mean for feds? Not much, actually. Federal law (Sections 8348 and 8438 of U.S. Code Title 5) requires the Treasury secretary to refill the coffers of the G Fund and the CSRF once the issue of the debt ceiling is resolved, and to make up, in addition, for any interest lost on those investments during the suspension. This is what happened during the 1995-96 debt ceiling crisis.

"No one who has invested TSP contributions in the G Fund can suffer any reduction in assets or loss of interest income as a result of the actions taken by the secretary of the Treasury," stated a 2002 memo from the Congressional Research Service on federal employee retirement funds and the public debt limit.

In other words, you'll still get your money, even if Congress can't get it together to raise the debt

ceiling in the near future.

Bargaining Bill

Earlier this week, Sen. Sherrod Brown, D-Ohio, reintroduced a bill (<u>S. 572</u>) that would expand Veterans Affairs Department health care professionals' collective bargaining rights relating to compensation.

Current law prohibits VA health care professionals from negotiating with management on a range of compensation issues. VA health workers, for instance, cannot collectively bargain when management withholds overtime, weekend premium pay or wage survey data.

Brown's bill would give VA workers the right to bargain over some of those issues, but not allow them to negotiate on basic pay. He introduced similar legislation in 2010.





Biography - Elmo E. Collins

Elmo E. Collins was assigned as the Regional Administrator for the Region IV Office in September 2007. NRC Region IV is one of four regional offices. NRC Region IV is responsible for the inspection and safety assessment of 14 nuclear power plant sites (21 reactors). Region IV covers 22 states, including Alaska and Hawaii, overseeing the inspection and licensing of medical, academic, and industrial users of radioactive materials. Sixteen of those states are Agreement States which implement the NRC's materials inspection and licensing programs. Region IV also performs licensing and evaluation of nuclear power plant control room operators. Mr. Collins, originally from Oklahoma, graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, MD in 1976.

Mr. Collins has broad and extensive experience in the nuclear industry. He served for 6 years in the U. S. Navy as a nuclear trained submarine officer, serving on the USS Thomas A. Edison (SSBN 610). Mr. Collins completed his qualification to serve as engineering officer on nuclear powered submarines in May 1980. After leaving the Navy, Mr. Collins worked in the commercial nuclear industry as a startup engineer with General Electric from 1983 to 1987, receiving certification as a Senior Reactor Operator.

Mr. Collins joined NRC Region I in 1987 as a resident inspector at Oyster Creek, where he later became the Senior Resident Inspector. In 1991, Mr. Collins transferred to NRC Region IV as a Senior Project Engineer. In Region IV, he subsequently held positions as Inspection Team Leader, Senior Reactor Analyst, Reactor Projects Branch Chief, and Nuclear Materials Branch Chief. Mr. Collins was appointed to Senior Executive Service in May 2000 as the Deputy Director for the Division of Reactor Projects. In February 2003, Mr. Collins was assigned the position of Director, Division of Nuclear Materials Safety in Region IV. In July 2004, Mr. Collins was re-assigned to NRC Headquarters Office of Nuclear Materials Safety and Safeguards (NMSS) in Rockville, Md. as the Deputy Division Director for the licensing and inspection of the high-level radioactive waste repository at Yucca Mountain. In October 2006, Mr. Collins was assigned to the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) as the Director, Division of Inspection and Region Support.

During his career, Mr. Collins has been involved in inspection and oversight of nuclear power plants, licensing and oversight of users of radioactive materials, and licensing of the high-level radioactive waste repository. In NRR, Mr. Collins was responsible for the operating reactor inspection and assessment, operator licensing, and operating experience programs. Mr. Collins

has participated with the International Atomic Energy Agency Teams evaluating the performance of nuclear regulatory programs and assessment of nuclear plant operational safety performance in other countries.

NRC: Not all equipment failures at U.S. nuclear plants are reported

NRC CANCELS CRYSTAL RIVER PLANT RESTART MEETING

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff has <u>cancelled</u> a meeting to discuss the restart of the Crystal River plant after indications of a new separation or gap in the concrete containment.

The meeting was scheduled to be held at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, March 22 near the plant, which is operated by Progress Energy on the west coast of Florida about 80 miles north of Tampa. A similar meeting will be scheduled by the NRC in the area before the plant restarts.

Progress Energy has reported that there are indications of additional separation or gap resulting from the repair work on the original containment wall. NRC inspectors will closely follow Progress Energy's analyses as well as any planned repairs.

The Crystal River plant shut down in the fall of 2009 for a planned refueling outage that included replacement of the steam generators. To move the large steam generators into the containment building, workers removed concrete to create the necessary opening. During that work, the plant staff discovered a separation or gap in the concrete containment wall. The Crystal River plant has been shut down since then while Progress Energy investigated the cause of the gap and repaired the concrete containment.



Although the RES Operating Experience work collects information from event reports and other sources, it does not do so to assess safety significance, generic implications, or further regulatory action. RES uses operating experience in a database system to estimate PRA input parameters and perform risk studies. The Operating Experience product also supports Accident Sequence Precursor (ASP) analyses, the Significance Determination Process (SDP) and the Risk-Informed Performance-Based Plan. Thus, the RES Operating Experience product should remain under the Research product line in the Operating Reactors business line.



Thanks for the response. The problem I'm having is that the programs/processes for completion of GI-186 and GI-189 (i.e., essentially regulatory commitments because of marginal/low safety significance) are not defined by an Office Instruction or similar policy document. The only precedent I know of is GI-163, which was complicated by a DPO resolution. Therefore, I've been trying to develop a comprehensive set of documents similar to GI-163 closure documents in my spare time.

I'll continue down the GI-163 path for now. I have been discussing the issues with ACRS staff to understand the level of involvement they would like in the closure.

Page 9 of the MD 6.4 handbook simply indicates that GIs in regulatory office implementation (ROI) are tracked and updated in GIMCS through completion of actions. The memo (ML071630094) that transferred GI-189 (and some others) to ROI states "the status updates, tracking, and reporting for these GIs will cease when NRR informs RES that regulatory actions and follow-on closure actions identified in the transition memorandum (and other documents) have been completed in accordance with applicable Regulatory Office programs and processes." Accordingly, all the GI Program needs from you is a notification via e-mail, GIMCS input, or memo (that is in ADAMS or that we can put in ADAMS and reference). If the NRR programs or processes used for GIs 186 and 189 completion do not include ACRS briefing or endorsement prior to completion, you may want to consider doing that because of previous ACRS involvement with these issues.

I hope this answers your question. If I can be of further assistance, please let me know.

The House of Representatives Committee on Oversight and Government Reform has requested documents and information related to the Yucca High-Level Waste Repository matter. NRC employees are directed to maintain all pertinent documents falling within the scope of the request, which is described below. Requested records, documents, data, or information should not be destroyed, modified, removed, transferred or otherwise made inaccessible. The request includes documents or information in your possession or control or held by employees or agents acting on your behalf. The request includes electronically stored information (ESI) which is the preferred format, as well as hard copies of documents.

What You Need to Do

It is your responsibility to ensure that any potentially relevant information related to this matter/case that is

within your possession, custody, or control, is preserved and not destroyed, even if the policy or practice of your office would normally dictate otherwise.

What Must Be Preserved

The information that must be preserved includes Electronically Stored Information ("ESI"), hard copies of documents, and tangible things. ESI includes, but is not limited to, computer files of any type (word processing documents, e-mail messages, spreadsheets, calendar entries, and flash memory media, including USB drives and memory cards). Cantor: Next step on government funding debate is up to Senate

David Brenner, director of Columbia University's Center for Radiological Research, noted that the TSA uses the full-body X-ray scanners at some airports but allows passengers at other airports to pass through millimeter wave scanners, which do not use ionizing radiation. There

are no known health risks of the millimeter wave machines, Brenner told lawmakers during a congressional oversight hearing Wednesday. "X-rays," he said, "are a carcinogen." MORE

Intel contract staffs need freedom, encouragement to innovate, experts say

Federal Times: MIAMI — Industry should be given more freedom in determining how to meet the contract needs of defense intelligence agencies, experts say.

In an announcement this week, she said only 120,000 people would be dropped from the rolls, but future enrollment would be frozen. The plan would require most patients to pay more for their care, and doctors and hospitals would get lower fees, according to a report in The Arizona Republic. Some of her proposals have been rejected by the federal government when they have been tried before. MORE

Instead, in a marathon stage show that was part Steve Jobs and part Anthony Robbins, the Republican governor enthusiastically tried to convince Ohioans that the cuts are a good thing — and that they will be better off with less. FL: Gov. Rick Scott's 32,000 projected port jobs face sizable hurdles

Orlando Sentinel: Hours after rejecting Florida's high-speed train, Gov. Rick Scott declared the state would spend \$77 million on dredging the Port of Miami — a project he said would create 30,000 permanent jobs.

But some experts contend digging out the Miami channel will not boost employment by anywhere near that number, much less ensure more shipping to the port. <u>MORE</u>





TECHNICAL EXCHANGE AND COOPERATION ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION (USNRC) AND THE EUROPEAN ATOMIC ENERGY COMMUNITY (EURATOM)

Minutes of the 1st Coordination Meeting

JRC Corporate Services (Brussels, Belgium), JRC Institute for Energy, Petten (NL), USNRC Headquarters (USA)

July 20, 2010

Introduction

This first coordination meeting between the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC) and the European Atomic Energy Community (Euratom) was held by videoconference on July 20, 2010 at three sites: Joint Research Centre (JRC) Headquarters (Brussels, Belgium), JRC Institute for Energy, Petten (NL), United State Nuclear Regulatory Commission (USNRC) Headquarters (USA). The meeting was chaired by J. Dehn and D. Haas, the coordinators for the U.S. and EURATOM, respectively. The agenda is included as Attachment 1, and meeting participants are listed in Attachment 2. Attachment 3 contains the collaborations held with DG RTD coordinated projects.

1. Opening remarks, agenda.

From the Euratom perspective, the videoconference link was good between Brussels and Petten but was very weak with the US and for most of the meeting only audio and a static image was available. From the perspective of the US, video and audio connection with the feeds from Brussels and Petten was of average quality, but was intermittent with the connection being lost several times throughout the call. In each case it appeared that the Euratom signal was able to redial and reconnect to the USNRC.

D. Haas, welcomed the participants for this meeting and introductions were made from all parties. For the USNRC, B. Sheron provided an introduction and began introductions.

2. Collaboration status between NRC and JRC on "Direct Actions"

RELAP/Thermal Hydraulic Codes.

The USNRC briefly reviewed the history of this umbrella agreement and pointed out that this meeting should include a follow-up of a previous action on the JRC IE to review their research programme (that could be found in NUREG-1925), and that one focus for this call should be the CAMP agreement and the financial/in-kind contributions to be made.

JRC IE replied that they have received the draft agreement and made minor modifications. They further proposed to lift to annual fee of 50,000 US\$ since the JRC is a research centre, and instead to compensate with in-kind contributions on the topic of liquid metal reactors, which could possibly include the application of the RELAP5 code to the sodium fast reactor design. If successful, the application may extend to lead fast reactors as well.

The USNRC pointed out that there are restrictions on commercial use of the code especially on using it for design purposes for reactors that are in competition with the

US ones, and would likely need to seek specific guidance from their Office of General Counsel to review any potential conflict.

The JRC IE underlined that activity with the codes is only focussed on benchmarking it with other European codes (CATHARE, ATHLET) for Gen4 liquid metal fast reactors and only for safety analysis and in no way the JRC is involved in the design phase of these reactors.

The USNRC proposed that TRACE should be used rather than RELAP as the latter does not have any more technical support or follow-up. JRC IE indicated that they are familiar with the TRACE code, but have more in-house experience with RELAP. JRC IE indicated that their main objective is to find a computer code that can be used as an alternative code to benchmark the calculations that are generated from the other European codes. Finally, in order to assess the request to lift the CAMP fee the USNRC would need budgetary evidence of the JRC IE to justify the request. Additionally, USNRC staff would need to communicate that sort of fee reduction through the highest ranks and would need approval from the Commission.

Due to time constraints it was decided that bilateral discussions will continue between the USNRC and JRC IE. The USNRC noted that this was a good starting point and look forward to reviewing the input from JRC IE.

ACTION 1.1 JRC IE will assess with its staff the possibility to work with TRACE.

ACTION 1.2 JRC IE will send to the USNRC budgetary information to justify the request for lifting of the CAMP fee and proposed in-kind contributions to compensate it.

Generation IV reactor safety principles

The JRC IE informed its interest in safety requirements for new reactors with its participation in IAEA groups and was interested in collaboration with the USNRC in this domain.

The USNRC pointed out that specific division in their organisation deals with it and focus is currently set on the HTGR and on the integral light small modular reactors supported by industry. They also informed that there is ongoing a research program to investigate the behaviour of graphite at high temperatures with first results due in 2013.

The USNRC pointed out that there is public available documentation of its areas of research and will transmit it to the JRC IE. The IE mentioned the HTR 2010 conference in Prague, where JRC plays significant role as one of the main co-

organizers. The US NRC representatives will also participate in this conference and further exchange of information can be expected

ACTION 1.3 USNRC will send to JRC IE and to DG RTD the available documentation on GenIV activity (HTGR), including the Phenomena Identification and Ranking Table (PIRT) reports conducted by the USNRC, the USNRC research plan for HTGR/NGNP, the USNRC Integral Modular Reactor research plan and the US Department of Energy Research Plan for HTGR/NGNP.

NPP Operating Experience and Clearinghouse

The JRC IE briefly summarized the last actions on the European Clearinghouse on Operational Experience Feedback (NUSAC) and pointed out that there is already a contact but via the USNRC "office of nuclear reactor regulation" (NRR) rather than the "office of nuclear regulatory research" (RES). The primary contact for the USNRC is John Thorp (NRR) and the senior manager is Eric Leeds (Director of NRR). The USNRC pointed out that internal discussions are needed in order to know exactly how to pursue the collaboration.

The USNRC described its current contributions to OEF for use by the European Clearinghouse and other members, via its IRS reports (25% of them originate from the US) and by providing feedback to the OECD/NEA group on OEF.

In August 2010 the USNRC will send a lecturer to a workshop to be held in Petten at the JRC IE. In January 2011 the NRC is invited again to be an observer in the annual Clearinghouse meeting.

During the conference call, there was a question of whether the Arrangement between Euratom and NRC covers this sort of information exchange. The Arrangement does cover all sorts of unclassified information exchanges, not just research.

ACTION 1.4 – As soon as determined, USNRC will inform JRC IE on its plans for further collaboration with the European Clearinghouse on Operational Experience Feedback.

3. Collaboration status between NRC and RTD on "Indirect Action"

DG RTD prepared a table providing the lists of existing and potential collaborations of NRC in the RTD FP7 Indirect Actions. It concerned 7 projects: PERFORM 60, SARNET2, ASAMPSA2, EUROPAIRS, NULIFE, Phébus FP and ISTP. This table

was distributed (Attachment 3).and the status and contact points of each project were addressed.

An ASAMPSA2 workshop will be held in Spring 2011 in Europe. USNRC will ensure the appropriate contact, Don Helton, is aware of this.

For EUROPAIRS, USNRC identified the contact as Tarek Zaki, <u>Tarek.Zaki@nrc.gov</u>. For the USNRC, concern remains over the industry-heavy participation in EUROPAIRS. USNRC is currently participating to learn about ongoing efforts, not to contribute resources. JRC IE spoke of a new effort that will begin soon that will be composed of mostly regulators – JRC IE will provide information when available.

4. Long-term operation of NPP to be discussed in future conversations

IFRAM (International Forum for Aging Management)

The JRC IE pointed out that USNRC is already informed via Mr. G. Carpenter. The DG RTD project NULIFE is represented in IFRAM with the presence of Mr. Rintamaa in its Steering Committee.

Development of an RPV embrittlement data base

This subject was not developed as the participants were not available

NULIFE (P. Manolatos, G. Carpenter):

This subject was not developed as the participants were not available

Fuel behaviour during spent fuel storage

The USNRC pointed out their interest in the behaviour of spent fuel in dry casks relative both to the fragility associated with the reorientation of the hydrides to a radial configuration (during transportation) and to the evolution of its chemical/mechanical characteristics during very long dry storage. The USNRC identified Richard Lee, Richard.Lee@nrc.gov as the appropriate contact.

The JRC informed the USNRC about the fuel activities in JRC ITU that focus on corrosion, damage due to helium build-up. The appropriate contact at ITU (programming level) is franck.Wastin@ec.europa.eu.

6. Next meeting:

The JRC suggested the meeting to be held on either April 14 or 15, 2011 at the premises of USNRC since there is a similar coordination meeting of EURATOM with DOE in Washington DC, on April 12-13, 2011.

Feedback from RES/DE Staff

What went well?

- 1. The session coordinators managed to have speakers lined up sequentially so that the materials they presented would be unnecessarily repeated to save time and avoid boring the attendees. (M. Bayssie)
- 2. There was diversity among the speakers and the topics that each of them covered. (M. Bayssie)
- 3. Having free parking available for the attendees was an excellent idea, as it encouraged more people to attend the RIC, especially NRC staff located in satellite buildings. (M. Case)
- 4. The NRR team did an outstanding job organizing the event long before it happened. From session coordinator tools, to the internal RIC website, to training for presenters, and responsive key personnel on several process/protocol-like questions, I must say that they made it very easy to the session coordinators. The hard work done by the NRR RIC team clearly paid off as evidenced by the success of the conference and the organization through the 3 days of the conference. (DE/DICB)
- 5. The audio visual equipment was great. The sessions were extremely informative and generally on time. (DE/DICB)
- 6. The presentation quality was very good- the RIC speaker training was very good and helped presenters prepare for addressing a large audience. (DE/DICB)
- 7. There was outstanding support from the room monitors and other volunteers who successfully fulfilled last-minute requests from the session coordinators. (DE/DICB)
- 8. Audiovisual tech personnel were very attentive and responsive to our requests. Presentations were uploaded to the corresponding session rooms with no issues at all. (DE/DICB)
- 9. Hotel personnel turned around the plenary session into breakout rooms with sufficient time to allow session coordinators to prepare for their sessions. (DE/DICB)
- 10. I heard from our customers that the Digital I&C session went very well. The NRO/DE Acting Deputy Director (J. Dixon-Herrity) was sitting in the front row, and said that the presentations were excellent. (S. Birla)
 - Dan Santos quoted a visitor from "Naval Reactors" saying that "he was hearing a different NRC, i.e., a refreshing perspective".
 - Tom Bergman and Pat Hiland mentioned that they heard the messages they wanted to get across to the audience. Example: Consistent hammering on the complexity issue.
 - Speakers managed their timing well, not encroaching on Q&A time.
 - Q&A time was well used. We got good questions, which allowed us to send the right messages home.
- 11. About the sessions on "Seismic Analysis Activities for Operating Reactors" and "Regulatory Challenges in New Reactor Technical Reviews" (R. Roche):

• Both sessions were very well coordinated and conducted. The room size selected for these subjects were appropriate. The session panelists included very knowledgeable professionals (from both the NRC and the Public). The presentations were based on current topics of interest. Questions were answered satisfactorily with appropriate level of details. Finally, I think these sessions provided a great forum for the exchange and discussion of seismic related technical information, and the overall regulatory challenges from both the NRC's and the public's perspective.

What didn't go well?

- 1. We limit the number of posters in total and we keep them against the wall or at an acute angle instead of making a T with the windows. This created traffic jams down the main hallway and people used the poster alcoves as sanctuaries from the traffic which resulted in less people being able to view or question the presenters. (A. Csontos)
- 2. The exit doors to the hotel's terrace were a concern for the poster staff when standing by their poster. Cold wind and rain was a nuisance. (DE/DICB)
- 3. Some of the presenters at the RIC did not finish their presentations due to the time constraints. (DE/DICB)
- 4. Session on "Seismic Analysis Activities for Operating Reactors" (R. Roche):
 - There were some technical difficulties with the computer (i.e. a delay in the slide progression), although it was resolved in a timely manner.

What do you recommend for next year to improve the event?

- 1. On the sign up page it would be helpful if a synopsis of the papers to be presented were available. It was difficult to choose between a few of the sessions based only on the title. (T. Herrity)
- 2. The speakers should decide to speak to us as professionals. Let us ask questions if we don't understand. A few speakers wasted half their time with very basic information that a professional level audience should know. (Respect the audience, don't talk down to them.) (T. Herrity)
- 3. The speakers should be required to do a timed "dry run" in front of the other members of the panel or at least the panel chair. The guests could do it via tele-conference with the slides e-mailed for the panels viewing. This would avoid some running way over their time. Also, several speakers (particularly NRC employees) frequently stumbled and hunted for the next word. An occasional "umm" or "uh" is OK. But, when they get to frequent that makes the speaker look unsure of the subject. That really detracts from their presentation and the public image of the NRC. (T. Herrity)
- 4. Speakers should be aware that just reading the slides to the audience is not an effective presentation. It's boring and insulting. Why should an audience member go to the trouble and expense of attending, just to be read to. An audience member could stay home or attend another session and read these slides on the web after the RIC. The audience wants to hear the presenter's view and opinion on the subject. (T. Herrity)

- 5. Limit the number of posters or make them smaller so that they are not perpendicular to the flow of hallway traffic. The poster orientation significantly reduced the walking space and made the RIC seem very crowded in between sessions. It also made viewing posters difficult if the posters weren't located on the end. (DE/DICB)
- 6. Have more signage directing people entering the hotel from the metro/white flint buildings to go downstairs to the check in area for registration. One of our staff members was manning a table top and was bombarded with registration questions instead of people interested in the tabletop topic. (DE/DICB)
- 7. Some presenters were not able to see comments from the audience, apparently a portion of the comment cards/feedback in certain sessions did not get back to the presenters. This was not the case in our session. (DE/DICB)
- 8. Provide handouts in each session, some sessions did not have printed handouts available. (DE/DICB)
- 9. Be clearer on the content and intended audience for the sessions. Maybe if organizers provide specific details on what topics the session(s) will cover it could lead to a better selection of sessions by the audience. (DE/DICB)
- 10. Again organize a Digital I&C research session that looks above and beyond the fray of day-to-day licensing review disagreements between staff and industry. (S. Birla)
- 11. Have more speakers on the panel from outside the NRC, including other federal agencies and federally funded R&D labs. Examples (S. Birla):
 - Software Certification Consortium: Dr. Alan Wassyng
 - Jet Propulsion Lab: Dr. Gerard Holzmann
 - Naval Research Labs: Dr. Constance Heitmeyer
 - SRI: Dr. John Rushby
 - MIT: Dr. Nancy Leveson
- 12. Availability of Teleconferencing and GoToMeeting should be considered. (S. Birla)
- 13. I would recommend to always considering including sessions in the RIC related to *Earthquake Engineering* and *Regulatory Challenges in New Reactor Technical Reviews.* (R. Roche)
