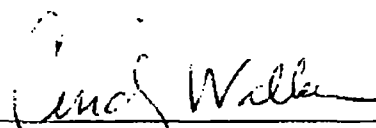

Pursuant to the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, I request the following information:

1. Any email or correspondence pertaining to a drug or alcohol test taken by (b)(6) (b)(6) (b)(6) Note: There are several variations for the spelling of (b)(6) name] on or around May 2013. (b)(6) took this test while applying for a job at the Perry nuclear plant. The correspondence may have been sent or received by the resident inspectors and Region III NRC staff overseeing the Perry nuclear plant. This list of potential NRC employees includes, but is not limited to:
 - Mel Gray, Chief, Reactor Projects, Branch 4
 - S. Hansell, Senior Resident Inspector
 - A. Ziedonis, Resident Inspector
 - Michael Kunowski, Chief, Branch 5

 - J. Nance, Resident Inspector
 - B. Kemker, Senior Resident Inspector
 - T. Dimitriadis, Resident Inspector
2. Any email or other correspondence pertaining to a drug or alcohol test taken by (b)(6) that may have been sent or recirculated during July 2015 between the same NRC parties listed in Item 1.
3. Any email or other correspondence pertaining to a drug or alcohol test taken by (b)(6) on or around May 2013 that was sent or received by:
 - Members of the NRC's Region III office;
 - The Deputy Executive Director for Reactors and Preparedness Programs;
 - The Executive Director for Operations;
 - The Director of Public Affairs;
 - The Director of Congressional Affairs

I would like to receive the information in electronic format.

I am making this request as a reporter with The Associated Press and this request is made as part of newsgathering and not for commercial use. As a representative of the news media I am only required to pay for the direct cost of duplication after the first 100 pages.

I ask that you waive any and all applicable fees associated with this request. Through this request, I am gathering information on a man with violent tendencies who attempted to seek employment at an operating nuclear power plant regulated by the NRC. (b)(6) (b)(6) during an attack on U.S. military facilities this month. FBI officials have publicly said the government is investigating whether (b)(6) had contact with any foreign terror groups.

Release of this information is in the public interest because it will contribute significantly to public understanding of government operations and activities, particularly the fitness-for-duty regulations and the safety oversight of the nation's nuclear fleet. The public has a compelling interest in knowing whether those operating nuclear plants are appropriately screened or likely to commit sabotage or terrorism. If you deny this request for a fee waiver, please advise me in advance of the estimated charges if they are to exceed \$50.

If my request is denied in whole or part, I ask that you justify all deletions by reference to specific exemptions of the Act. I will also expect you to release all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material. I reserve the right to appeal your decision to withhold any information or to deny a waiver of fees.

I also ask that you provide expedited review of this request which concerns a matter of urgency. The information sought relates to a currently unfolding story, specifically, an attack that killed five U.S. servicemen and women. Second, delaying release of the information harms the public interest in knowing what actions are being taken to screen workers at the power reactors spread across the country. A single accident or attack at a nuclear plant could affect the lives of thousands, even millions, of residents. Third, the request obviously concerns federal government activity, as the request seeks information on the oversight rules and process set by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Finally, as the world's oldest and largest news organization, the AP is a credible requester. I certify that my statements concerning the need for expedited review are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

If you deny expedited processing, I expect to receive a response to the request within 20 business days, as the statute requires.

As I am making this request as a journalist and the information is of timely value, I would appreciate your communicating with me by telephone [404-308-9916] or e-mail [rhenry@ap.org], rather than by mail, if you have questions regarding this request

Finally, I note that President Obama's January 21, 2009 "Presidential Memorandum for the Heads of Executive Departments and Agencies on the Freedom of Information Act" specifically

stated that "[i]n responding to requests under the FOIA, executive branch agencies should act promptly and in a spirit of cooperation, recognizing that such agencies are servants of the public." Moreover, it held that "[a]ll agencies should adopt a presumption in favor of disclosure, in order to renew their commitment to the principles embodied in FOIA, and to usher in a new era of open Government. The presumption of disclosure should be applied to all decisions involving FOIA."

In the spirit of such cooperation and the presumption of disclosure, I look forward to your prompt response.

Waiver_Purpose: UCS seeks the requested record to better understand the NRC staff's concerns about the single failure vulnerability identified in the Oconee CDBI report (ML14178A535) and discussed in Duke Energy's response letter (ML15139A049).

Waiver_ExtentToExtractAnalyze: UCS obtained related TIA 2014-04 via FOIA 2015-00384. The TIA contained information not available in the CDBI report and Duke Energy's response letter (such as fuller background on the history of the issue at Oconee.) That information significantly enhanced our understanding of the matter. UCS seeks the requested record with the expectation that it will provide us with better context of this issue, too.

Waiver_SpecificActivityQuals: Electrical protection problems have been a recurring topic for UCS to discuss publicly, from our Futility at the Utility report on EDG undervoltage settings at Fermi 2 to degraded voltage protection issues more recently at Hatch. UCs seeks the Oconee information to first understand what happened there but also to gain insights into why Operating Experience efforts undertaken after the Fermi 2 and Hatch events did not reveal similar problems at Oconee sooner.

Waiver_ImpactPublicUnderstanding: Because the requested document is not publicly available and the only public references to it have been in NRC and industry reports heavy with technical jargon and acronyms, UCS's commentaries on this matter will most likely be the only way the general public learns about it. UCS also hopes to reach another audience - workers at other nuclear plants. Apparently, info about single failure vulnerabilities is not getting out despite similar events at Millstone and Byron, so we hope that our commentaries on this Oconee event will also reach workers at other nuclear plants who don't yet know much about it.

Waiver_NatureOfPublic: The local community around Oconee has interest. I've made two trips to South Carolina in recent years to talk at public events that were well attended. The larger implications from this event - why OE didn't trigger the problem to be caught sooner - appeals to a national audience as it reflects on the industry's and the NRC's safety oversight efforts.

Waiver_MeansOfDissemination: UCS has a website and blog that we post commentaries and materials to. We will likely issue a blog commentary and a short report for our blog and website, respectively. UCS may also package this issue with other related issues at Oconee and in the industry for longer reports/commentaries.

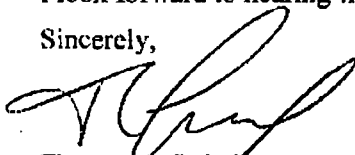

Enclosed is a letter dated January 21, 1975, from a representative of the Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers International Union (OCAW) alleging a violation of a Nuclear Regulatory Commission regulation. In addition to this allegation, we have been informed that other non-union employees have lost their jobs which could also represent a violation of this regulation. The allegations have been discussed with Mr. Tom Henderson, Management and Labor Section and Mr. Al Hantman, General Crimes Division, of the Department of Justice.

Based upon these discussions we have concluded that the Kerr-McGee Nuclear Corporation is in possible violation of 18 USC Section 1505 and Section 1510 and 10 CFR Section 19.16(c) and that these possible violations should be investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, under the criminal provisions of 42 USC Section 2273, pursuant to 42 USC Section 2271(c).

In addition to the OCAW's letter of January 21, 1975, which is attached as Enclosure A, we are enclosing copies of the following documents which relate to this case:

- (1) A copy of a letter dated January 27, 1975, with attachment, from a representative of the OCAW wherein it is requested that the investigation of the contamination of Karen Silkwood be reopened to determine if she was intentionally contaminated. (Enclosure B) Such an investigation also appears to fall within the purview of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

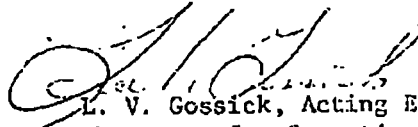

Waiver_Purpose: The NRC inspection report dated June 27, 2014, (ML14178A535) described the Component Design Basis Inspection (CDBI) conducted at Oconee. Duke Energy's letter dated May 22, 2015, (ML15154A490) referenced this CDBI report and provided answers to questions the letter said were asked of NRR by NRC Region II via TIA 2014-04. UCS read the CDBI report and Duke's related letter. We seek the

requested document because TIA 2014-04 is not publicly available and we want to ensure we have the full understanding of the issues raised during the CDBI.

Waiver_ExtentToExtractAnalyze: UCS will review the requested record to see how it fits in the protected service water modification at Oconee and the post-Fukushima electricity reliability requirements.

Waiver_SpecificActivityQuals: The CDBI documented concerns with the emergency power system at Oconee. The CDBI concerns potentially affect both the design basis and beyond design basis response capability of the plant. UCS will review the requested record along with publicly available information. UCS seeks to fully understand the CDBI concerns and their potential impact on public health and safety.

Waiver_ImpactPublicUnderstanding: UCS has made two trips to South Carolina in recent years to talk with local citizens about safety issues at Oconee. We've also responded to numerous media and citizen email and phone inquiries about Oconee's safety issues. UCS seeks the requested record so as to sustain our role as a objective information broker regarding safety issues at this facility.

Waiver_NatureOfPublic: According to the NRC (ML11216A185), 3,174,858 people live within 50 miles of the Oconee plant. While not every member of this population will be interested in this matter, our experience with attendance at the meetings conducted during our two trips to South Carolina and with the volume of media and citizen inquiries strongly suggests to us that enough people are interested to warrant our efforts understanding this matter and communicating our perspectives on it.

Waiver_MeansOfDissemination: UCS posts commentaries about nuclear safety at least once per week to our blog, AllThingsNuclear.org. We post short reports, fact sheets, issue briefs, and long reports about nuclear safety topics to our website, www.ucsusa.org. Dear NRC Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) Officer,

On behalf of the three non-profit public interest organizations named below I am hereby filing a request under the Freedom of Information Act to be processed according to procedures stipulated in FOIA regulations implemented by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, including a response within 20 business days.

This request is being filed on behalf of these duly registered non-profit organizations: Savannah River Site Watch (Columbia, South Carolina), Snake River Alliance Education Fund, Inc. (Boise, Idaho) and the Oak Ridge Environmental Peace Alliance (Oak Ridge, Tennessee).

I hereby request a waiver of any fees that might be incurred related to this request. All three of our organizations are actively engaged in not-for-profit public education activities utilizing scientific and public policy information related to activities by the U.S. Department of Energy. Likewise, we will use the information from the NRC documents obtained under this FOIA request as part of our public-policy public education work in the states of South Carolina, Idaho, Tennessee and nationally. The documents sought are unique in nature and their release could result in significant understanding of the spent fuel issues at hand. The information obtained will also be used with public officials, state regulatory agencies and/or federal advisory panels in our respective states and could significantly contribute to their understanding of the issue as well.

Our organizations have decades of collective experience and have shown that we have full ability to utilize obtained information and that we can effectively disseminate such information to the public and government entities. All of our organizations have utilized the Freedom of Information Act in seeking to obtain documents from DOE and have been granted fee waivers. The information sought is related to an overall program by the DOE to ship spent fuel for research and other purposes from commercial nuclear reactors to DOE sites, and NRC documents obtained via this FOIA request will prove invaluable in the public's understanding of nuclear transport and spent fuel research and disposal. The information will be used in documents that we will prepare, including news release, letters to government officials and in

fact sheets and blogs for our websites and Facebook pages. We have no commercial interest in any documents that may be obtained.

The NRC has granted approval to Secured Transportation Services (460 Silverberry Lane, Sugar Hill, GA 30518) for shipping routes of commercial spent fuel between the North Anna nuclear power plant and the U.S. Department of Energy's Idaho National Lab [ML15077A157]; from North Anna to Oak Ridge National Lab [ML15273A333]; from the Byron nuclear power plant to the Idaho National Lab [ML14233A205]; from DOE's Argonne National Lab to the Idaho National Lab; and from Byron to the Savannah River Site [ML15125A410]. As DOE has considered shipments from Byron to the Oak Ridge National Lab, NRC documents on that shipping route may exist.

- 2. Any attachments to the above-listed applications.**
- 3. NRC evaluations of the above-listed applications.**

Information sought in this request might be provided by Mr. Gerard Jackson and Mr. William Gott in the NRC's Fuel Cycle and Transportation Security Branch, Division of Security Policy, Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response. The scope of this FOIA request is inclusive of any common variations of the names provided above. To clarify, this request is inclusive of any phone and meeting/visitor records. Further, when applicable, the scope of this request includes any means of communication used to conduct official business including the use of personal phones, BBMs, and personal email.

The time frame of this request is from January 21, 2009 to February 1, 2013. The job titles provided are for assistance in identification purposes only, and my request is not limited to only when an

individual is acting in the capacity of the identified position.

In order to help you determine my status to assess fees, you should know that I am requesting on behalf of the Republican National Committee (RNC) and this information is not primarily in the commercial interest of the RNC.

I am willing to pay fees for this request up to a maximum of \$25. If you estimate that the fees will exceed this limit, please inform me first. However, I would also like to request a waiver of all fees in that the disclosure of the requested information is primarily in the public interest and will contribute significantly to the public's understanding of the operations of your agency.¹

The Department Of Justice recommends that each federal agency employ six factors to determine whether a fee waiver is appropriate in a FOIA request.² The first such factor is "whether the subject of the requested records concerns 'the operations or activities of the government.'"³ The records requested here go directly to the actions of agency personnel as they operated in their official capacities.

The second factor is "whether the disclosure is 'likely to contribute' to an understanding of government operations or activities."⁴ Here a primary focus is on the present availability of the information and whether it has previously been released to the public.⁵ To the best of the requestor's knowledge, the information contained in the requested records has never been publicly disclosed nor appeared in news reports. As such, its undisclosed nature makes it very likely to contribute to the understanding of the government operations that it describes.

The third factor is "whether the disclosure of the requested information will contribute to 'public understanding.'"⁶ This turns on "whether the requester will disseminate the disclosed records to a reasonably broad audience of persons interested in the subject."⁷ The RNC is in a position to make the information widely available. It has an extensive history of publications on its website, GOP.com, and its members and affiliates regularly interact with and appear on national media outlets. Thus, the RNC not only has the desire to furnish these records to a broad audience, but has a substantial ability to do so.⁸

Fourth, an agency is directed to consider "whether disclosure is likely to contribute 'significantly' to public understanding of government operations or activities."⁹ In determining the significance of the contribution, an important element is media attention and public interest in the material. Widespread media attention of an issue greatly increases the likelihood that additional information would significantly contribute to the public's understanding of the government operation or activity in question.¹⁰ As previously noted, the RNC is well positioned to bring media attention to an issue and routinely engages with issues of public import that garner substantial press coverage.

The fee waiver guidance next looks at the question of "whether the requester has a commercial interest that would be furthered by the requested disclosure."¹¹ The RNC is not a corporation or business that exists to pursue profits or actively participate in the commercial sphere. There is no readily identifiable commercial interest of the RNC to which this information pertains.

Should your agency determine, however, that some commercial interest exists, it would then have to turn to the final factor: "whether the magnitude of the identified commercial interest of the requester is sufficiently large, in comparison with the public interest in disclosure, that disclosure is 'primarily in the commercial interest of the requester.'"¹² Given the RNC's significant ability to contribute to the public discourse on matters of national significance, any potential commercial interest would be dwarfed in comparison to the public interest in the disclosure of such information.

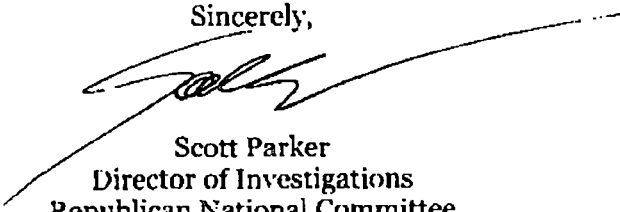
