Introduction

- Due to level of detail in regulations and dry storage system CoCs, multitude of active amendments available for loading
- Revision process makes a change to an existing amendment and supersedes existing amendment entirely
 - ✓ Reduces number of active amendments available for loading
 - ✓ Changes should consider existing, stored casks
- Revision process is different from the corrections process used for editorial errors



Holtec Revision Experience

- 4 Revisions either completed or close to completion
- Revisions take as long or longer than typical amendment reviews
- Letters requested from sites to accept changes
- Implementation period for revisions 4 revisions handled in 3 different ways



Revision Experience

- HI-STORM FW Amendment 1, Revision 1
 - Changes including contents and material
 - ✓ Submitted 7/31/2013 (as Amd 2), effective 12/17/2014
 - ✓ When issued, no HI-STORM FW Amendment 1 systems had been loaded
 - ✓ Posted in Federal Register with standard 30 day public comment period and effective date 45 days after, if no significant comments received
 - ✓ Cover letter sent with signed CoC instructed users who had loaded Amendment 1, implement Amendment 1, Revision 1 within 180 days of Rev 1 effective date

Revision Experience



- HI-STORM 100 Amendment 8, Revision 1
 - ✓ Changes including content and material two sites had previously loaded Amendment 8
 - ✓ Submitted 8/21/2013 (as Amd 10), will be effective 2/16/2016
 - ✓ NRC requested letters from sites stating that they would voluntarily implement the Revision 1 changes
 - ✓ Published in Federal Register with standard comment period and effective date
 - ✓ After comment period, staff determined that the effective date should be 180 days later to allow time for implementation
 - Still creates difficulty with one day switch, Revision 0 effective on Feb 15, 2016, Revision 1 on Feb 16, 2016
 - ✓ Discussions with staff indicate that a grace period will be given in cover letter
 - ✓ Similar approach for HI-STORM FW Amendment 0 Revision 1



Upcoming Revisions

- HI-STORM 100 Amendment 9, Revision 1
 - ✓ Same changes as Amendment 8, Revision 1
 - **✓** Submitted 7/1/2014
 - Letters also requested from sites who had loaded Amendment 9
 - Currently in rulemaking
 - ✓ Expect a CoC condition allowing for a 180 day implementation period where original amendment is still effective – allows for overlap



Recommendations

- Written guidelines for the revision process
- 180 day implementation period preferred over 180 day lag in effective date
 - Short overlap where both original amendment and revision are effective
 - ✓ Gives CoC holders and sites necessary time to update documentation
- Remove need for sites to provide letters agreeing to implement revisions voluntarily – impractical when large number of sites impacted
