

Bio for Nader Mamish, Chair
Emergency Preparedness Session

Mr. Nader L. Mamish serves as the Deputy Director for Emergency Preparedness, in the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response at the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Mr. Mamish supports the NRC mission to protect public health and safety and the environment by leading and managing the emergency preparedness aspects of licensing actions, inspections, rulemaking, interfaces with security and outreach.

Mr. Mamish's organization is responsible for developing emergency preparedness policies, regulations, programs, and guidelines for both currently licensed nuclear power plants and potential new nuclear power plants. His organization provides technical expertise regarding emergency preparedness issues and interpretations, and conducts technical and regulatory reviews of emergency preparedness applications and amendments. His organization also coordinates, as appropriate, with other NRC organizations on emergency preparedness matters. In addition, his organization coordinates, as appropriate, with the Department of Homeland Security, the Food and Drug Administration, and the Environmental Protection Agency and other federal and state government agencies on emergency preparedness matters. Also, his organization manages emergency preparedness communication with internal and external stakeholders including the public, industry, the international nuclear community, and federal and state government agencies. His organization provides oversight and technical direction for the emergency preparedness cornerstone of the reactor oversight program. His organization also provides emergency preparedness technical support for incident response activities regarding actual incidents and exercises, as well as support for inspection activities.
