Mr. Tracy has worked for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission since 1989. He has held positions of increasing responsibility, including roles as a reactor inspector, senior resident inspector, staff supervisor, manager and leader for key agency programs and initiatives. He has worked in the Region I Office, King of Prussia, PA, and the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response, the Office of the Executive Director for Operations, and the Office of the NRC Chairman in Rockville, MD. He was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in 2000 and directed the operator licensing, radiation protection, security and emergency preparedness programs for operating reactors. After September 11, 2001, he was selected to be the Director of the Division of Nuclear Security in the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response and led the development and implementation of a vast array of initiatives for reactors and radioactive materials within the Nuclear Sector. Most recently, he was selected to be the Director of the Division of Construction Inspection and Operational Programs. In this position, he is responsible for the development of policy and the management of the construction inspection program for new commercial reactors. His division is also responsible for the agency's review of quality assurance and radiation protection programs and technical specifications for new reactors, as well as conducting vendor and quality assurance inspections and new reactor operator licensing.

Prior to joining the NRC, Mr. Tracy served for seven years on active duty as a submarine officer in the U.S. Navy's Nuclear Power Program. Mr. Tracy currently holds the rank of Captain in the Navy Reserve and serves in the Office of the Secretary of Defense – Homeland Defense. He has a Bachelor of Science degree in Naval Architecture from the U.S. Naval Academy. In 1994, he received NRC's Meritorious Service Award for Inspection Excellence. In 2006, he received the Presidential Meritorious Rank Award.
