

Session Title: Emergency Preparedness and Incident Response—Update of Significant Emergency Preparedness Issues

Description: Recent hostile action-based drills, conducted as an industry initiative in response to NRC Bulletin 2005-02, provided licensees and local and state response organizations with valuable lessons-learned regarding the unique challenges posed by hostile action scenarios. The NRC, in coordination with the FEMA, is currently involved in a rulemaking effort to update emergency preparedness (EP) regulations and guidance. This session will provide an update on these initiatives. In addition, this session will address the results of a recent wide-ranging survey of EPZ populations regarding public response during emergency events. The results of this survey, published in NUREG/CR-6953 Volume 2, will inform potential changes for evacuation planning and effective risk communications and is intended to support a proposed revision to Supplement 3 to NUREG-0654, Criteria for Protective Action Recommendations for Severe Accidents.”
