Rod Krich during his more than 30 years in the Nuclear Power Industry has held various positions in Licensing and Engineering. He is currently the Senior Vice President, Regulatory Affairs for UniStar Nuclear Energy, LLC (UniStar Nuclear Energy is a consortium between Constellation Energy Group, Inc. and EdF formed to license and build the U.S. Evolutionary Power Reactor (EPR)). In this position, Krich is responsible for managing the effort to obtain combined operating licenses for EPRs.

His previous job as Vice President for Licensing Projects, Exelon Generation Company, involved leading the successful effort to obtain a license for a uranium enrichment plant, a venture that Exelon was a partner in, and in the Early Site Permit effort. Krich joined Exelon in 1998 as the Vice President of Regulatory Services and was responsible for interfacing with the NRC, State Regulatory Agencies, and the Regulatory Programs area for Commonwealth Edison's corporate office and the six nuclear stations.

Prior to Exelon, Krich served in various positions at the Carolina Power & Light Company. Krich also worked at Philadelphia Electric Company, Virginia Power, and Consumers Power Company. Rod Krich began his career at the General Atomic Company and had two assignments to the French Atomic Energy Commission.

Krich received his BS Degree in Mechanical Engineering from New Jersey Institute of Technology in 1972. In 1973, he received his MS Degree in Nuclear Engineering from the University of Illinois.
