

Scott Morris

Since March 2007, Scott Morris has served as the Deputy Director for Reactor Security in the NRC's Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response, responsible for new and operating power reactor security-related policy and guidance development, rulemaking, and licensing activities. The scope of these security-related activities includes physical security, cyber security, access authorization and fitness-for-duty. Mr. Morris is also responsible for several inter-governmental activities including liaison with the Department of Homeland Security, and ongoing efforts to enhance integrated Federal, State and Local law enforcement response to power reactor sites following security events. Prior to his current appointment, Mr. Morris served as the Reactor Security Branch Chief, a Senior Technical Assistant in the Office of the Executive Director for Operations, and the Senior Resident Inspector at two power reactor sites in NRC Region I. Mr. Morris joined the NRC in 1993 after serving 7 years of active duty in the U.S. Navy Submarine program. Mr. Morris earned a B.S. in Electrical Engineering from Penn State University in 1986.
