Mr. Raione is the Chief, Hydrologic Engineering Branch, with the NRC's Office of New Reactors. He oversees the hydrologic and water resource aspects of safety and environmental reviews for all new reactor applications nationwide. These reviews result in the development of safety evaluation reports (SER) and NEPA environmental impact statements. He has also served as Chief, Environmental Projects Branch, with the NRC where he oversaw EPA and EIS activities associated with new reactors. Mr. Raione represents the NRC to the ACWI Subcommittee on Hydrology and is also currently licensed as a Professional Geologist in 19 states. His work experience over the past 26 years has been in the area of environmental protection, characterization and remediation. He has worked as a sub-district chief for the USGS, a hydrologist with the DOE, and as an environmental projects manager/corporate hydrogeologist for the commercial sector consulting arena. Originally from Florida, Mr. Raione received degrees in biology and geology from East Tennessee State University and an academic scholarship from the DOE to attend the University of Kentucky where he earned his MS in geology. His interests include climate change impacts and anything that gives him a reason to be in the mountains (i.e., Grand Tetons), along any coastline, or islands, doing science related work, or more likely, hiking.
