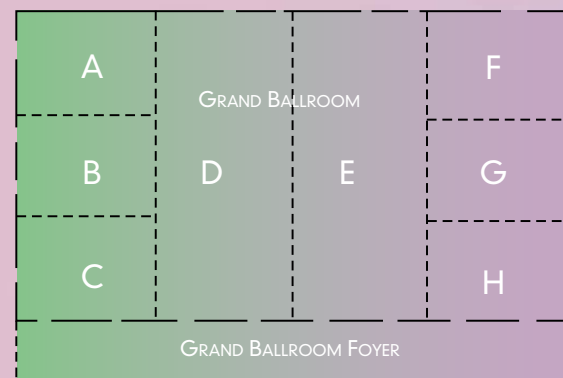




HOTEL FLOORPLAN

INCIDENT RESPONSE EXPERIENCE TOURS

A Tour of the NRC Operations Center

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) invites attendees to experience the inner workings of its Operations Center, which serves as the focal point for coordination of events involving NRC-licensed facilities or materials. This session will emphasize select incident response assets, including Radiological Assessment System for Consequence Analysis and Emergency Operations Center End of Cycle. It will also address the roles and responsibilities of various teams that comprise the NRC response organization and the resources that the NRC uses when communicating with external stakeholders and licensees during an emergency. The Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response (NSIR) will host the session. Photo ID is required.
