**Regional Tie to Force-on-Force Exercises**  
**Performance-Based**

- Regional inspectors provide support for preparation phase; headquarters has lead.
- Regional inspectors are a part of the inspection/exercise team.
- Regional inspectors are required to observe, at a minimum, one licensee annual Force-on-Force exercise over the triennial inspection cycle (per IP 71130.05).

**Regional Role In Security Baseline**  
**Inspection-Based**

- Regional inspectors have the lead for components of the physical protection baseline inspection program (PPBIP) (apart from Force-on-Force).
- Regional baseline inspection procedures are conducted on an annual, biennial, or triennial basis.
- Inspection observations used to inform NRC's semiannual assessments and Force-on-Force exercise preparation.

**Regional Role In Security Baseline  
Interface with Resident Inspectors**

- Regional inspectors work with resident inspectors to be cognizant of security items.
- Regional inspectors work with resident inspectors to identify target sets (IP 71130.14).
- Regional inspectors coordinate findings with resident inspectors.

**Regional Role In Security Baseline  
Dispositioning Findings**

- Headquarters staff has the lead in all Force-on-Force (exercise) findings.
- Regional inspectors have the lead in inspection-related findings.
- Findings are used in plant assessments. However, security finding details are not presented publically.
