Integrated University Program (IUP)

Integrated University Program (IUP):

- IUP is congressionally authorized, providing \$45M to three agencies: NRC, U.S. Department of Energy, and National Nuclear Security Administration.
- NRC provides \$15M to support education in nuclear science, engineering, and related disciplines to develop a workforce capable of the design, construction, operation, and regulation of nuclear facilities and the safe handling of nuclear materials.
- IUP provides for scholarships and fellowships in nuclear science, engineering, and related disciplines and for faculty development grants.
- IUP provides \$5M to support multi-year research projects that do not align with the NRC mission but are critical to maintain nuclear science and engineering disciplines.
- All IUP student recipients must agree to work 6 months in the nuclear industry for each full or partial year of support.
- As a result of the NRC'S IUP funding, over 3,000 students have received financial support towards earning nuclear related certificates, undergraduate, graduate and Ph.Ds in nuclear disciplines and hundreds have gained employment in the nuclear industry.
