The Role of NEI



- As part of the US Nuclear Industry Response Framework, the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) will serve as the principal organization responsible for providing information to governmental agencies and representatives, the media, the financial community, and the general public with respect to high-level industry-wide implications of an event.
- NEI will notify its members of events that require industry-wide alignment on communications.
 - During the "Nuclear 17" event, NEI fielded multiple media interviews.
- NEI participates in calls with federal stakeholders to discuss external public communications.
 - During the "Nuclear 17" event, daily calls were held with:
 - Government Sector Coordinating Council (FBI, DHS, DOE)
 - Electric Sector Coordinating Council (Edison Electric Institute)

Cyber Security Threat, Events, and Communications



- NEI's cyber security task force, formed in 2002, continuously monitors possible cyber threats and upgraded protected approaches needed to counter them.
- The nuclear industry is briefed quarterly and as needed by Federal intelligence officials on potential physical / cyber threats and the industry takes appropriate action to counter those threats.
- Under the Nuclear Sector Coordinating Council (NSCC), NEI is facilitating the establishment of an intelligence working group to better coordinate industry security needs with the federal intelligence community's capabilities.
