SUBJECT: ANNUAL ASSESSMENT LETTER - SHEARON HARRIS NUCLEAR POWER
PLANT (NRC INSPECTION REPORT 05000400/2005001)

Dear Mr. Scarola:

On February 9, 2005, the NRC staff completed its end-of-cycle plant performance assessment of the Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant. The end-of-cycle review for Harris involved the participation of the reactor technical divisions in evaluating performance indicators (PIs) for the most recent quarter and inspection results for the period from January 1 through December 31, 2004. The purpose of this letter is to inform you of our assessment of your safety performance during this period and our plans for future inspections at your facility. This will allow you an opportunity to prepare for these inspections and to inform us of any planned inspections that may conflict with your plant activities. This performance review and the enclosed inspection plan do not include physical protection information. A separate end-of-cycle performance review letter, designated and marked as "Exempt from Public Disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390," will include the physical protection review and a resultant inspection plan.

Overall, Harris operated in a manner that preserved public health and safety and fully met all cornerstone objectives. Plant performance for the most recent quarter, as well as for the second and third quarters of the assessment cycle, was within the Licensee Response Column of the NRC's Action Matrix, based on all inspection findings being classified as having very low safety significance (Green) and all PIs indicating performance at a level requiring no additional NRC oversight (Green).

However, plant performance for the first quarter of the assessment cycle was within the Regulatory Response Column of the NRC's Action Matrix based on the Unplanned Scrams per 7000 Critical Hours PI crossing the Green/White threshold during the last assessment cycle. As discussed in our last Annual Assessment Letter, dated March 3, 2004, The PI became White due to four reactor trips that occurred during calendar year 2003. A Supplemental Inspection using NRC Inspection Procedure 95001 was conducted in September 2003, and determined that your corrective actions for the increased number of reactor trips were adequate. Based on the results of the Supplemental Inspection and the current performance of Harris, we plan to conduct only reactor oversight process (ROP) baseline inspections at your facility through September 30, 2006.

Also, a previously discussed unresolved item involving the adequacy of cable wrap fire barrier qualification test and installed configurations continues to be reviewed.

Also, as discussed in our Mid-Cycle Performance Review Letter, dated August 30, 2004, the NRC issued a Notice of Violation (NOV) and Proposed Imposition of Civil Penalty to Carolina Power and Light Company (CP&L) on April 7, 2004. CP&L had discriminated against a corporate site access authorization superintendent, when the individual was terminated from his employment on April 26, 1999, for engaging in a protected activity. Prior to the issuance of the NOV, CP&L provided corrective action on this matter in a letter dated March 19, 2004, and on April 29, 2004, paid the civil penalty.

The enclosed inspection plan details the inspections less those related to physical protection scheduled through September 30, 2006. The inspection plan is provided to minimize the resource impact on your staff and to allow for scheduling conflicts and personnel availability to be resolved in advance of inspector arrival onsite. Routine resident inspections are not listed due to their ongoing and continuous nature. The inspections in the last nine months of the inspection plan are tentative and may be revised at the mid-cycle review meeting.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be made available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records (PARS) component of NRC's document system (ADAMS). ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html> (the Public Electronic Reading Room).
