SUBJECT: PUBLIC MEETING TO COMMUNICATE SECURITY  
MATTERS - REVISED AGENDA

In accordance with SECY-03-0064, "Options for Communicating Security Matters Effectively with the General Public in Meetings," and the associated SRM, dated October 1, 2003, the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response (NSIR) is planning a public meeting to communicate security-related matters with the public. Attached for your approval is the proposed revised agenda for the first public meeting to be held under the new guidance. Talking points will be submitted for Commission approval based on feedback on the agenda.

NSIR had originally scheduled the meeting for May 12, 2004, in the NRC Auditorium. That meeting has been canceled to allow sufficient time for Commission approval of the agenda and, subsequently, the talking points. A proposed meeting agenda was forwarded to the Commission for information by memorandum dated March 17, 2004. In the past few weeks, the staff has been adjusting the agenda to be consistent with Commission direction in related areas. The attachment reflects these changes.

The staff will reschedule the meeting based on Auditorium availability upon receipt of Commission approval of the agenda and talking points.
