Drill & Exercise Cycle

- Regulations are an improvement
 & move us in the right direction
- Preconditioning is a major issue
- Six year cycle still lends itself to a degree of predictability
- Locals have many scenarios to exercise in addition to REP



Hostile Action Based Exercises

- Just REP exercises with on-scene ICS demonstrated vs simulated
- We anticipated many differences and discovered very few locally
- Exercise structure received mixed reviews from first responders
- Relevant purpose but structure and conduct needs improvement

Licensee NIMS/ICS Integration

- HSPD-5 mandates Federal agencies, but not State/Locals
- Requiring licensees may mandate a system not adopted locally
- Some degree of training desirable for those interacting on-scene
- This was supported by Hostile Action Based experiences

Backup Alert & Notification

- Capability vs. Performance criterion is a positive approach
- Allow flexibility to use new technology & what works locally
- Engage FEMA to update guidance
 & methodology accordingly
