I. SECY-99-286 - GPU Nuclear Corporation, Docket No. 50-219-OLA-2, Memorandum and Order (Terminating Proceeding), LBP-99-45 (Dec. 15, 1999)

The Commission approved a Memorandum and Order which vacates LBP-99-45, grants GPU's request to withdraw without prejudice its license amendment application, and terminates the proceeding.

(Subsequently, on December 22, 1999, the Secretary signed the Memorandum and Order.)

III. SECY-99-287 - Niagara Mohawk Power Corp. et al. (Nine Mile Point, Units 1 and 2), Docket Nos. 50-220 and 50-410

The Commission approved a Memorandum and Order which grants standing to the co-owners of Nine Mile Point, Unit 2, permits the New York Attorney General to participate in a manner analogous to a participating government under 10 CFR 2.715(c) should a hearing be granted, rejects co-owners' "suggestion" that formal hearing procedures be applied in this case, and provides a short suspension of the proceeding.
