MS. VIETTI-COOK: The Commission is being asked to act on a Final Rule amending various sections of 10 CFR Part 72, miscellaneous changes to licensing requirements for the independent storage of spent nuclear fuel and high level radioactive waste. These changes differentiate the requirements for the storage of spent fuel under wet and dry conditions, clarify requirements for the content and submission of various reports, and specify that quality assurance records must be maintained as permanent records when identified with activities and items important to safety. The Commission has voted to approve the publication and implementation of this final rule subject to the comments and changes provided in the attachment. Would you

please affirm your vote?
