2	AFFIRMATION SESSION

4	CHAIRMAN MESERVE: Good morning. We have a little
5	bit of business before we turn to our briefing for this
6	morning.
7	We have I think two matters to be dealt with by
8	way of affirmation.
9	Madam Secretary, will you proceed?
10	SECRETARY COOK: The Commission is being asked to
11	act on a memorandum and order responding to three petitions
12	to intervene and one petition to participate as a
13	governmental entity in the license transfer proceeding for
14	the Indian Point 3 and Fitzpatrick Nuclear Plants.
15	Petitions to intervene were received from the
16	Citizens Awareness Network, the Nuclear Generation Employees
17	Association, along with three individual members of the
18	association Local 1-2 of the Utility Workers of America and
19	the Town of Cortlandt and the Hendrick Hudson School
20	District filing together. The union recently withdrew its
21	petition to intervene. Also, Westchester County has sought
22	to participate as a governmental entity, although not as an

23 intervenor. 24 The Commission has voted to approve a memorandum 25 and order which grants in part and denies in part various 3 1 aspects of these petitions. 2 The memorandum and order finds that all remaining 3 petitioners have demonstrated standing and that each has 4 advanced at least one admissible issue. 5 Westchester's petition for governmental 6 participant status is also granted. 7 The memorandum and order sets the case for 8 hearing. 9 Would you please affirm your votes. [Chorus of ayes.] 10 11 [No noes.] SECRETARY COOK: Commissioner Dicus had previously 12 13 voted to approve this memorandum and order and had she been present would have affirmed her prior vote. 14 15 The second item the Commission is being asked to 16 act on, an order responding to petitions to intervene and request for hearing submitted by Mr. Mark Oncavage and 17 18 Joette Lorion in setting schedule requirements for the 19 hearing, the Commission has voted to approve an order which 20 refers the petitions to the Chief Administrative Judge of 21 the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board Panel for assignment 22 of an Atomic Safety and Licensing Board to rule on these and 23 any additional requests for hearing and petitions for leave 24 to intervene and if a hearing is granted to conduct the 25 proceeding. 1 In addition, the order provides the Licensing 2 Board with guidance for the conduct of any proceeding if the 3 hearing is granted and a suggested schedule for any such 4 proceeding. Would you please affirm your votes. 5 [Chorus of ayes.] 6 7 [No noes.] SECRETARY COOK: Again Commissioner Dicus had 8 9 previously voted to approve this memorandum and order and had she been present would have affirmed her prior vote. 10 That is all I have. 11 CHAIRMAN MESERVE: Good. Thank you very much. 12 [Whereupon, at 9:05 a.m., the affirmation session 13
