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NRC to Hold Regulatory Conference on Safety Issue at Comanche Peak Nuclear Plant

ARLINGTON, Texas — Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hold a [regulatory conference](#) with Vistra Operations Company LLC to discuss a safety finding at the Comanche Peak Nuclear Power Plant in Glen Rose, Texas.

The apparent violation involves the company's failure to return a Unit 2 safety chiller to operable status as required by the plant's technical specifications. The issue was documented in an April 2026 inspection [report](#) and has been preliminarily categorized as "white," meaning it has low safety significance but still warrants additional NRC oversight.

The meeting will allow Vistra to present its perspective and provide additional information before the NRC makes a final determination. No decisions on the final safety significance or any potential NRC actions will be made at the meeting.
