NRC Announces Opportunity to Request a Hearing on Nine Mile Point Subsequent License Renewal Application

ROCKVILLE, Md. — The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission has [announced](#) an opportunity for the public to request a hearing on an application for 20 additional years of operation for the Unit 1 boiling-water reactor at the Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station in Scriba, New York.

What: Constellation Energy Generation LLC filed the [application](#) on March 25 seeking to extend the length of the reactor license from 60 to 80 years. Unit 1 is currently licensed to operate through Aug. 22, 2029.

The NRC staff has [determined](#) that the application contains sufficient information for the agency to formally docket it and begin its safety and environmental reviews. Docketing the application is not an indication of whether the NRC will renew the license.

How: The [notice](#) in today's Federal Register includes instructions for filing hearing requests. The filing deadline is June 29. Additional information on the [hearing process](#) is available on the NRC website.
