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NRC to Host Public Meeting on Farley Nuclear Plant's 2025 Safety Performance

ATLANTA, Ga. — The Nuclear Regulatory Commission will [meet](#) with the public May 12 to share the results of its latest safety review of the Joseph M. Farley nuclear power plant, and to answer questions directly from the community.

The agency concluded that the Farley plant operated safely throughout 2025. The meeting offers residents an opportunity to hear what that means in practical terms and how the agency continues to oversee the facility.

The open house will take place from 6-7 p.m. Central time at the Dothan Public Library, 445 North Oates St., in Dothan, Alabama. NRC staff, including the resident inspectors assigned full-time to the site, will be available to answer questions about plant operations and oversight.

Farley, a two-unit plant operated by Southern Nuclear near Dothan, remains under the NRC's normal level of oversight. That designation includes thousands of hours of inspections each year.

The agency evaluates [plant performance](#) using a color-coded system that tracks inspection findings and performance indicators. At Farley, all inspection findings were green, and all performance indicators were within the expected range.

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission was created as an expert, technical agency to protect public health, safety, and security, and regulate the civilian use of nuclear materials, including enabling the deployment of nuclear power for the benefit of society. Among other responsibilities, the agency issues licenses, conducts inspections, initiates and enforces regulations, and plans for incident response. The NRC is collaborating with interagency partners to implement reforms outlined in new Executive Orders and the ADVANCE Act to streamline agency activities and enhance efficiency.
