NRC Schedules Public Outreach to Discuss Callaway Nuclear Power Plant Performance

Arlington, Texas — Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will conduct an [information session](#) on June 9 to share the 2025 safety performance of the Callaway Energy Center and answer questions from the public. Callaway is a one-unit plant operated by Union Electric Company near Jefferson City, Missouri.

The NRC concluded that the Callaway plant operated safely throughout 2025. All inspection findings and performance indicators were of very low safety significance. As a result, the plant remains under the agency's normal level of oversight, which includes thousands of hours of inspections each year.

The information session will take place during the Fulton City Council meeting at 6:30 p.m. Central time at Fulton City Hall, 18 E. 4th Street, Fulton, Missouri. NRC staff, including the resident inspector assigned full-time to the site, will be available to explain how the agency assesses plant safety and to answer questions about plant oversight.

The agency evaluates [plant performance](#) using a color-coded system that tracks inspection findings and performance indicators.

The annual assessment [letter](#) for the Callaway plant, including upcoming inspection plans, is available on the NRC website. Current [performance information](#) for all U.S. reactors is also posted and updated quarterly.

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission was created as an expert, technical agency to protect public health, safety, and security, and regulate the civilian use of nuclear materials, including enabling the deployment of nuclear power for the benefit of society. Among other responsibilities, the agency issues licenses, conducts inspections, initiates and enforces regulations, and plans for incident response. The NRC is collaborating with interagency partners to implement reforms outlined in new Executive Orders and the ADVANCE Act to streamline agency activities and enhance efficiency.
