NRC Schedules Open House to Discuss Fermi Power Plant Performance

Naperville, Ill. — Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hold an [open house](#) May 27 in Carleton, Michigan, to give residents a clear look at how the Fermi nuclear power plant performed in 2025. The event offers an opportunity for the public to speak one-on-one with NRC inspectors who evaluate the plant throughout the year

The NRC's annual assessment found that the Fermi plant operated safely in 2025. All inspection findings and performance indicators were of very low safety significance, so the plant remains under the agency's normal level of oversight, which includes thousands of hours of inspections each year.

The plant operated by DTE Electric Company, has one unit located in Newport. NRC resident inspectors who work full-time at the plant, along with agency staff, will be available during the open house to explain the findings and answer questions. The open house will run from 2-3 p.m. Eastern time at the Carleton Branch Library Community Room, 1444 Kent St. in Carleton.

The NRC [Reactor Oversight Process](#) uses color-coded inspection findings and performance indicators to measure plant performance.

The annual assessment [letter](#) for the Fermi plant, including upcoming inspection plans, is available on the NRC website. Current [performance information](#) is also available and updated quarterly.

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission was created as an expert, technical agency to protect public health, safety, and security, and regulate the civilian use of nuclear materials, including enabling the deployment of nuclear power for the benefit of society. Among other responsibilities, the agency issues licenses, conducts inspections, initiates and enforces regulations, and plans for incident response. The NRC is collaborating with interagency partners to implement reforms outlined in new Executive Orders and the ADVANCE Act to streamline agency activities and enhance efficiency.
