## NRC Kicks Off Environmental Review of Cooper License Renewal

**ROCKVILLE, Md.** — The Nuclear Regulatory Commission is [inviting public participation](#) in the environmental review of an application from Nebraska Public Power District to operate Cooper Nuclear Station in Brownville, Nebraska, for another two decades beyond its current license.

**What:** NPPD submitted its [subsequent license renewal application](#) May 7, asking the NRC to extend Cooper's operating license from 60 to 80 years.

**How:** The notice in today's Federal Register includes instructions for the public to comment by July 16 on the environmental issues the agency should consider in the review.
