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## NRC to Hold Two Public Meetings on Fusion Machines Proposed Rule

**ROCKVILLE, Md.**—The Nuclear Regulatory Commission will hold two public meetings to discuss the agency’s proposed rule developing a regulatory framework under 10 CFR Part 30 for fusion machines. The [proposed rule](#) was issued for public comment on Feb. 26, 2026.

**When:** A [virtual public meeting](#) on Mar. 25, 2026, 1-3:30 p.m. Eastern time and an [in-person public meeting](#) on Apr. 7, 2026, 1-3:30 p.m. Eastern time.

**What:** The meetings will include NRC presentations and an opportunity for questions and answers; details on how to attend are included in the meeting notices.
